Italian Dish Is Real Find

Once in a blue moon, we run across a dish which is a real find. One such is macaroni shells with clams. You can keep all its ingredients right on the pantry shelf. It costs only pennies a serving, it's made in a few moments and best of all—it's fit for a gourmet!

Like so many excellent Italian dishes, our shells with clams needs only a tangy green salad, crisp bread and a bit of fruit to make a fine meal. Naturally you'll want plenty of hot, fragrant coffee, too. Don't forget... you'll need enough for main course and dessert!

MACARONI SHELLS WITH CLAM SAUCE
 8 oz. macaroni shells
 1/2 lb. butter
 1 large clove garlic
 1 10-oz. can minced clams
 1 tablespoon minced parsley
 Cook macaroni shells in boiling

Perfect Meal In One Dish

A perfect casserole is one that tastes perfectly wonderful and is just like magic to make. That's what you have when you combine a condensed cream soup, canned fish or meat, and a crunchy ingredient like potato chips.

One favorite combination on this pattern is condensed cream of mushroom soup, tuna, peas and potato chips. Another delightful version is cream of celery soup, salmon, green beans and cheese crackers. Below are recipes for a tempting foursome of these casseroles.

PERFECT TUNA CASSEROLE
 1 can (1 1/4 cups) condensed cream of mushroom soup
 1/2 cup milk
 1 7-ounce can (1 cup) tuna, drained and coarsely flake
 1 1/2 cups crushed potato chips
 1 cup unsalted cooked green peas, drained

Empty soup into a small casserole; add milk and mix thoroughly. Add tuna, 1 cup potato chips and peas to soup; stir well. Sprinkle top with remaining 1/2 cup potato chips. Bake in a moderate oven (350 F.) for 20 minutes. Makes 4 servings.

Crunchy Chicken Casserole: Follow proportions and directions for Perfect Tuna Casserole but make it with cream of chicken soup, cubed cooked chicken, corn flakes and unsalted cooked lima beans.

Salmon-Celery Casserole: Follow proportions and directions for Perfect Tuna Casserole but make it with cream of celery soup, salmon, cheese crackers, and unsalted cooked green beans (drained).

Lobster Mushroom Casserole: Follow proportions and directions for Perfect Tuna Casserole but make it with lobster instead of tuna.

TRIM YOUR LAWN WITH CHEMICALS

Here's welcome news for those people who dislike the strain of keeping lawns trimmed along the walks, between stones in the terrace, and such places.

It's a new chemical formulation that will slow down grass growth. Two doses a year should do the job and the chemical has no after-effect in the soil.

Tests show that it works well on bluegrass and all permanent grasses, but does not check the growth of crabgrass.

The chemical should be ready by next spring.
