

Bonneville Head Predicts More Power For Klamath

The Bonneville electric power transmission line should be hooked up here within the next year, according to W. E. Trommershausen, area director for the Bonneville Power Administration.

Addressing the Klamath Board of Realtors and special guests at a luncheon meeting here yesterday, Trommershausen painted the Bonneville picture thus:

1) The big transmission line which will bring the power here from the Columbia River BPA generators has been completed as far south as Redmond and the substation being installed there should be ready by Christmas.

2) Poles are now being set to run the line on south through Bend to Lapine.

3) Remaining line work is to be completed in March.

4) The line should reach Klamath Falls within a year.

5) Three huge transformers, are rated at 75,000 kilowatts but can deliver 120,000 kw., have already arrived here.

6) The actual amount of new power which will be available here is not yet known.

7) All Bonneville power sold here will be sold through the California Oregon Power Company and Copco will set the price.

Beyond and behind the kernels in this nutshell are several prime suppositions and questions.

How much new power can the Klamath County expect from Bonneville. You can forget, for some time at least, the 120,000 kw. potential of the new line. Trommershausen says the practice is to start new lines on comparatively light loads and gradually build up the flow.

No matter the actual amount of power made available, will it be so far possible on a guaranteed supply basis or will it be on an "interruptible" basis?

Bonneville now has two types of contracts. One assures consumers of a stable electricity supply the year-round, the other, the "interruptible" supplies power when there is a surplus but the supply may be curtailed at any time in favor of the stable contracts.

It is probable that the initial basis on which Copco and Bonneville work at other points. This is the "interchange" plan now used at Coos Bay and other places.

Under this plan, when Copco has surplus power supply it is turned over to Bonneville for use elsewhere and when Bonneville has a surplus it is turned over to Copco.

However, the plan fell short of expectations last winter. Copco officials say they have been led to expect that shortages in Copco areas would be curtailed by additional "interchange" power from Bonneville.

But when shortage time came, Bonneville said there was no surplus available to aid the Copco areas.

This situation should be eased however when new federal power developments now in various stages of construction or planning increase the total power supply.

Burgess Horse dam in Western Montana, for instance, is rapidly nearing completion. The proposed Hells Canyon dam on the Snake River is still authorized by Congress but the Bureau of the Interior is strongly campaigning for its approval.

A long-suspected Interior Bureau idea for the eventual linking of Bonneville and Northern California power dams was brought out in the open by Trommershausen in his talk. Many persons close to the power question have in the past suggested that the real reason behind the Bonneville-Klamath transmission line was a future inter-tie linking Bonneville with government power lines in California.

Asked about this yesterday, Trommershausen said no formal action had yet been taken toward such a move but added: "I hope that can be worked out."

The BPA director offered an opening view of the growth and importance of hydro-electric power in the Northwest.

Since Bonneville power was introduced 12 years ago, \$1.5 billion worth of plants have been manufactured in the Northwest through use of the federal power.

New plants and equipment with a total value of over \$300 million have been located in the Northwest.

Payroll, directly attributed to the availability of federal power, have in the past 10 years totaled over \$200 million in the Northwest.

Bonneville, with a total investment of approximately \$410 million, has been 23 per cent liquidated by revenues from the electrically generated power.

This is far ahead of the original liquidation schedule, says Trommershausen.

There is now a total of about 3 million kw. of power available in the Northwest. Dams being built or planned would approximately double that amount. But Trommershausen says predictions are that within another 10 years, the Northwest will need a total of 9 million kw. Where is the additional 3 million coming from? No one knows now.

But Trommershausen says we need all the power we can develop, whether it is generated by private industry or the government.

That view is significant in view of Copco's attempt to get approval for a big Klamath River power development. Final arguments on the Copco application are to be presented late this month.

The Federal Power Commission will render the decision.

The Department of the Interior, federal power source, has prepared a new color film on Northwest power development. Trommershausen showed the film yesterday at the conclusion of his talk.

In his talk, Trommershausen had displayed a very friendly attitude toward Copco.

But the film's glaring theme was: all major hydro-electric development in the Northwest should be integrated under a central authority for the most efficient use of the water. The central authority? The Department of the Interior, naturally.

But as Trommershausen said in his talk, we need all the power we can get in the Northwest, private or government.

If the Federal Power Commission feels that way, there is a very good likelihood of Copco's Klamath Canyon application will be approved.

In any event, the Klamath Country is apparently going to have a great deal more electricity in the next few years. . . . One way or another.
