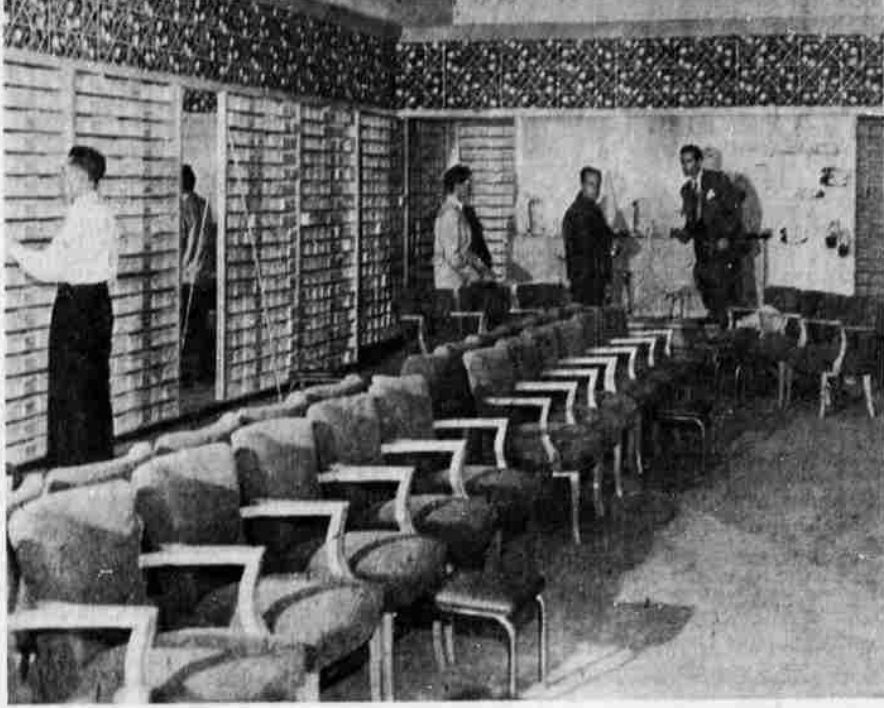
The Patricia Don Cossack chorus and dancers put on an outstanding performance at the Pelican Theater last night before a surprisingly poor crowd.

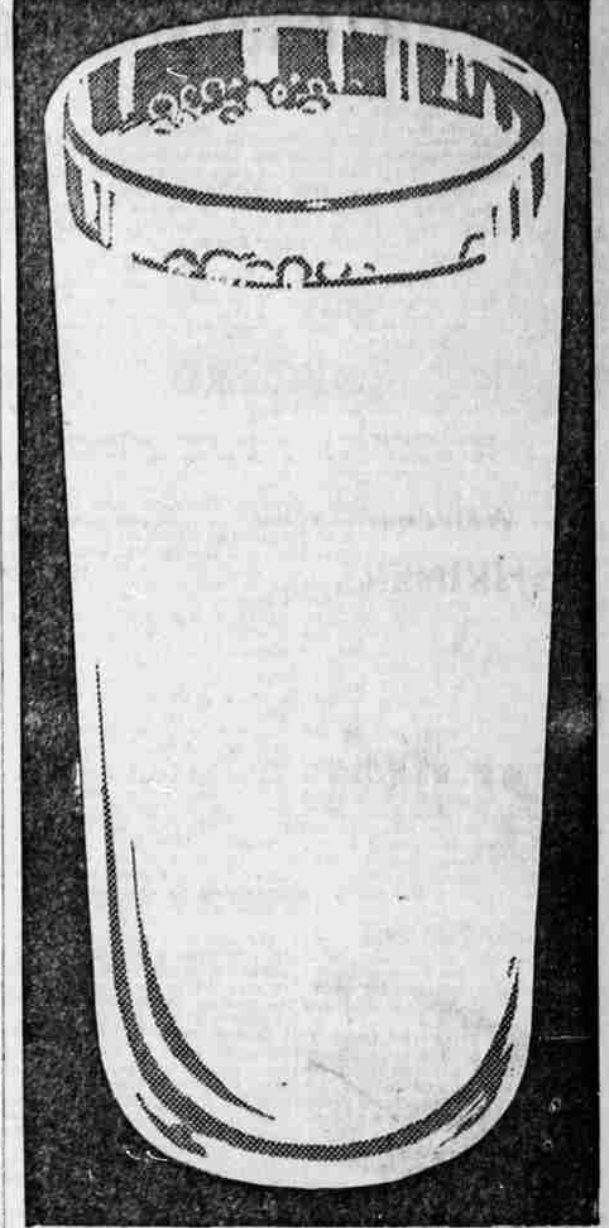
