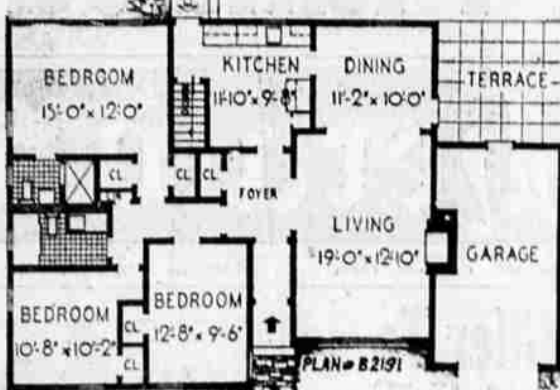

South Koreans Plan Welcome

PUSAN, Korea (AP)—The South Korean government has reversed signals once again and is planning a super-doofer welcome for President-elect Dwight Eisenhower, whose proposed visit to this war zone is supposed to be shrouded in utmost secrecy.
 A 15-man committee headed by acting Prime Minister Paik Toon is making plans for the show. The committee is composed of members of the executive, legislative and judicial branches and four patriotic organizations.
 The government will foot the bill for flower cars, posters, banners, arches and the full regalia of a Korean reception.
 A government spokesman earlier had promised the biggest spectacle in Seoul's long history.
 A special cabinet meeting was called for the formation of the committee.
 The government said previously that it might call off its original plan to give a big public reception for Eisenhower for "security reasons." But the light is green again.
 Special precautionary measures to insure security for Eisenhower have been set up by the Army and police.
 Local government authorities throughout South Korea will hold welcoming rallies for Eisenhower regardless of his appearance in the areas, a government spokesman said.

Doctor Fined On Dope Rap

LOS ANGELES (AP)—Actress Joan Leslie's husband, Dr. William C. Caldwell, has been placed on three years' probation and fined \$300 after pleading guilty to using fraudulent narcotic prescriptions.
 Dr. Caldwell, 37-year-old World War II Navy surgeon, told the court yesterday he became addicted to narcotics while using them after an attack of pneumonia last February. He said he shook the habit during a vacation trip to Wyoming last summer with his wife.
 The physician was accused of writing seven prescriptions in the names of patients and having them filled for his own use.

Sister Babe Wants Divorce

SANTA MONICA, Calif. (AP)—Mrs. Babe Blum, Jack Benny's sister-in-law, often the object of his jokes, has sued her husband, Myrt, for separate maintenance. She alleges mental cruelty.
 Mrs. Blum, 47, sister of Mary Livingstone, Benny's wife, asked for half the community property, which she values at \$300,000, and \$3,000 monthly support pending trial of the suit.
 The court yesterday ordered Blum, 62, to appear in court Friday to show cause why he should not contribute the support. The couple married 12 years ago. Blum's lawyer said he intends to file a cross-complaint for divorce, also charging mental cruelty.
