Treason Trial Hears Criminal

NEW YORK (AP)—A new interpreter was called into Federal Court today to handle the testimony of one of the Japanese ex-military officers of a captured U. S. Army captain in a Corridor.

The witness is Betsuro Fujita, 32, wartime sergeant now serving 30 years in a Tokyo prison as a war criminal for the slaying of Capt. Burton G. Thompson of Sweta City, Ia.

Fujita, brought from Japan as a government witness at the treason trial of John David Provo, began his testimony yesterday through an interpreter, Robert M. Kamide. The defense attorneys objected to some of the translation of Fujita's testimony concerning Thompson's death and Provo's actions on Corridor.

Provo, 35-year-old former U. S. Army sergeant who was captured on Corridor, is accused of betraying Thompson to the Japanese and of selling out other fellow prisoners to their captors. Fujita, head of the firing squad which executed Thompson, allegedly after a final quarrel with Provo, testified his superiors told him Provo would be of great advantage to them "because he could speak the language very well." The witness said Provo told of a prewar visit to Japan to study Buddhism. "He pleaded that I would work for the Japanese forces," Fujita said.

Wolves (Real) Worry Poles

WARSAW (AP)—Wolves are becoming an increasing menace in Poland's forest areas, where villagers and isolated peasants live in fear for their livestock and even their lives from these wild marauders.

Since the end of the war the wolves have increased in number and boldness in the vast forests of the Carpathian Mountains in the Southeast and the Masuria district of lakes and forests in Northeast Poland near the border with the Soviet Union.

In the Masuria district wolves attack watchdogs a few yards from home and raid livestock in farmyards. Farmers who have wandered too far into the forests unarmed have been killed.

Shepherds have been forced to bring their flocks of sheep closer to human habitation.

Authorities are organizing shooting parties and paying cash prizes for all wolves killed in an effort to combat the wild menace.

Lovett Wants To Level Off

NEW YORK (AP)—Secretary of Defense Robert A. Lovett says this country should find an "acceptable cruising speed" in our defense effort, instead of "costly ups and downs" dictated by Soviet propaganda.

Lovett spoke last night at an annual dinner of the National Institute of Social Sciences, which awarded him one of its gold medals for distinguished service to humanity.

In discussing the constant menace in the world today, Lovett said: "We must proceed calmly and confidently to develop and maintain the necessary forces without regard to the particular propaganda line taken by the Soviet Union for tactical purposes at that particular moment."

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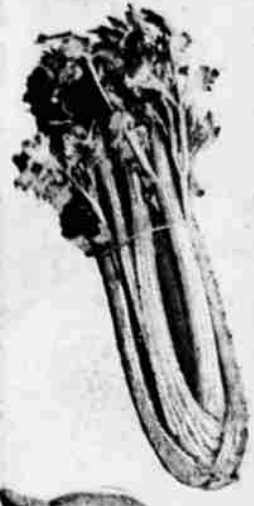
