# Encourage Your Hubby To Help Cook

Does your husband like to putter around in the kitchen? If he does nothing more than mix the salad dressing or season the meat, he'll be interested in "Trader Vic's Kitchen Kitchener, The Cookbook for Men." (Doubleday & Company, Inc., Garden City, N.Y.)

This is a real man's book with hearty recipes and man's talk—but as Victor Bergeron, author of the book, puts it, "One good idea is worth the price you pay for a cookbook." And here's an idea from the book to try on your husband.

**PETE'S MEAT BALLS**  
4 slices bread  
1 pound ground round steak  
1/2 pound ground pork  
3 eggs  
1/2 cup finely chopped parsley  
Salt and pepper  
1/2 cup Parmesan Cheese  
1 large onion  
1 clove garlic  
1 can tomato sauce  
Water (fill tomato sauce can 1/2 full)

**SCALLOP OYSTERS**  
By now you've probably served oysters to your family in all the old familiar ways. Time to try something new, or at least to vary the theme with a new twist. For something new, serve Oysters Rockefeller, a fine first course or main dish depending on how many oysters you have. Count on at least 6 oysters for each person when it's the main dish. Mix equal parts margarine or butter and fine dry bread crumbs; stir in twice as much chopped spinach (it doesn't have to be cooked, especially if it is frozen chopped spinach). Add some minced onion, and whatever other seasonings you would like. Cover each oyster on the half shell with spinach mixture and broil until heated through and bubbly. Then serve these delicious morsels immediately.

1-3 cup light cream  
1/2 cup margarine or butter  
1 1/2 cups enriched yeast-raised bread crumbs  
1/4 cup green pepper, chopped  
1/4 cup celery, chopped  
Salt  
Paprika

Soak the bread in water; squeeze thoroughly and mix with meat, eggs, seasonings and cheese. Make into tiny balls and fry quickly in oil. Set aside. Peel and chop the onion and garlic very fine and brown lightly in the oil in which the meat balls were browned. Add sauce and water; rinsing out can. If you want more gravy, add a can of Italian Mushroom sauce, also. Return meat balls to pan and simmer slowly about half an hour.

For a change, instead of serving oyster stew the traditional way—in a soup bowl with oyster crackers on the side—dress it up, stretch it and put more stick-to-the-ribs in it by serving it in the soup bowl over a slice of freshly toasted bread. And now for a budget dish—a familiar one but always a favorite. Scalloped Oysters made with enriched yeast raised bread crumb.

Drain oysters, reserving liquid. Mix liquid and cream. Melt margarine or butter, add bread crumbs and toss well until golden and crisp. Grease a baking dish and cover bottom with a layer of 1-3 of toasted crumbs. Add a layer of one half of the oysters. Top with one half of the green pepper, and celery and one half of the liquid cream mixture, sprinkling salt and paprika over all. Repeat layers and finish the top with crumbs. Dot with butter. Bake at 350 F. (moderate oven), 20 minutes. Makes 6 servings.
