Spuds Show Mixed Trend

Potato prices showed a mixed trend on Western markets this past week according to the weekly potato and truck crop review prepared by the Oregon State Extension Service yesterday.

At San Francisco Nov. 18, the market was slightly weaker and brokers' track sales of Russets from the Klamath Basin, U.S. No. 1A's, 15-16-inch minimum, brought 4.25 to 4.40.

Total shipments nationally and in Oregon are running ahead of a year ago—with more than 2,700 cars out of Oregon to date. About 2,200 cars had been shipped from Oregon to date a year ago.
