blazing flight across the polar icecap from California to Europe. The American-built Scandinavian Airlines System plane arrived here Thursday night after a trip that took 28 hours and minutes from Los Angeles. The flying time for the 5,883-mile hop was 23 hours and 38 minutes.

One of the two stops was at Thule. Without use of that far northern base the flight to blaze a trail for commercial flying across the bleak polar regions would have been impossible. The new route cuts off about four hours flying time from the U. S. West Coast to Scandinavia.

Said Redding: "I am convinced the new route will become the main highway of inter-continental air traffic. For one thing, flying over the Arctic is so much safer than crossing the North Atlantic. This means that the bleak settlement of Thule is destined to develop into one of the most important crossroads of the air age. Within a few years—say 10 or 15—there will be a rise as a modern metropolis of 500,000 citizens."

# Californians 'Inconsistent'

WASHINGTON (AP) — California canners were accused Thursday of "gross inconsistency" and trying to break down a constructive Japanese attitude by their attempts to limit U. S. imports of tuna.

These contentions were made by anti-tariff witnesses at a hearing before the U. S. Tariff Commission on the question of import duties on tuna.

Thomas F. Sandor, president of the Columbia River Packers Association, Inc., of Astoria, Oreg., complained of "gross inconsistency."

He said: "The Southern California packers made a determined effort before the Senate Finance Committee to keep Japanese tuna out, and then went home and bid up Japanese tuna to \$335 a ton."

Chairman Oscar B. Ryder interposed that the commission is not interested in consistency of inconsistency.

Jack Crivello, himself president of a California tuna business—Sun-Pacific, Inc., of San Diego—said in a statement that heavy purchases of Japanese tuna had been made this year by the industry in Southern California, and said there are reports they had tried to get more through Canada.

"In a manner of speaking, therefore," he said "the various California canners who joined with boat-owners in making a strenuous effort to obtain protection from foreign imports of raw tuna have been recently engaged in endeavoring to take the Japanese route."

The Japanese have voluntarily restricted exports to the U. S.

# Power Cos. To Up Rates

PORTLAND (AP) — Three Oregon power firms expect to increase their rates late this month because of the higher cost of producing electricity by steam in the power shortage.

Under authority granted in the power emergency last year, Portland General Electric Co. and Mountain States Power Co. said they will increase the rates 20 per cent after Nov. 24.

Pacific Power and Light Co. said it would boost rates 20 per cent in Portland and 11 per cent in the area it serves outside Portland. Rates outside the city already are higher than those in Portland.

The chairman of the PGE board, Thomas W. Delzell, blamed the increase on steam plants, which he said produced electricity costing four times more than that generated by water turbines.

He estimated PGE costs were up 1 1/2 million dollars since September, because of the steam plants.

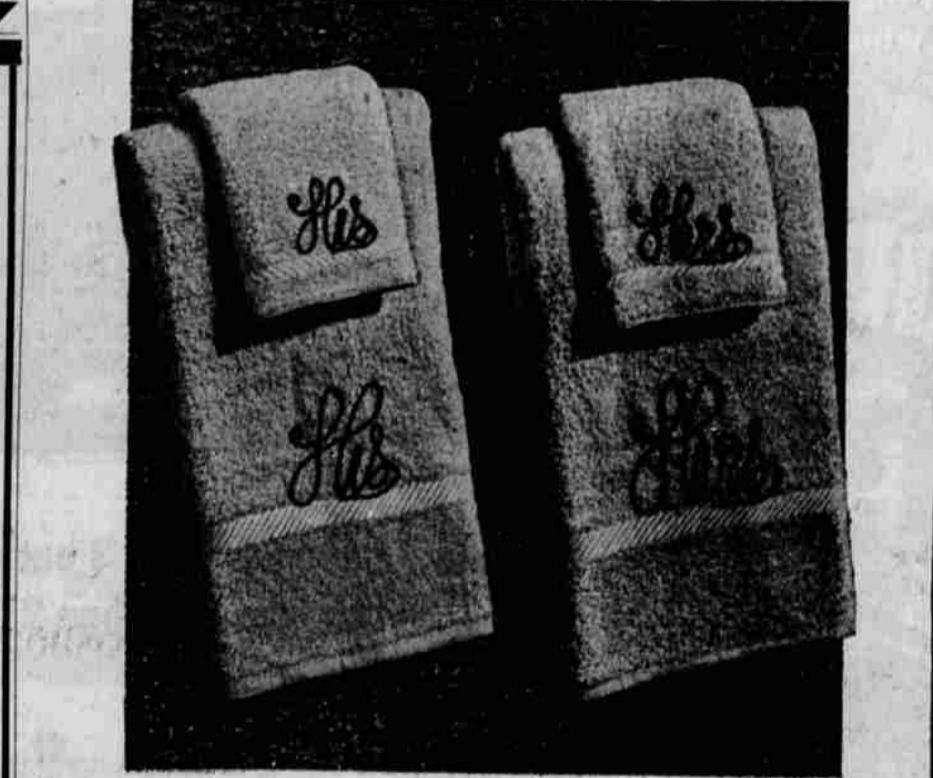
