

Fierce Snowstorms Hit Dixie

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. (AP)—A quirk of shifting air masses dumped up to 22 inches of snow yesterday on mountain areas of four Southern States—Tennessee, North Carolina, Virginia and Kentucky—paralyzing communications and transportation for many hours. Despite rapid melting caused by relatively high ground temperatures, the unexpected storm left a large area of ill-prepared Dixie looking like a polar outpost. The snow blanket measured 10 inches here early today. It was by far the heaviest fall ever recorded here and possibly the heaviest ever recorded this far south. But the resulting snarl in normal community living and approach of the intensity of the three-day ice storm which struck Tennessee and other Southern states early in 1951. This city of 125,000 had a total fall estimated officially at 22 inches during the 74-hour period yesterday. The precipitation totals of water measured 2.32 inches. This was the highest figure reported from the affected areas, but communications were still blacked out to many mountain areas to the east early today. Early reports included a few casualties. A young man and woman were killed at a railroad crossing at nearby Morristown. The accident happened at the height of the snowstorm, but officers were not sure it could be blamed on the storm. Two women were injured, apparently not seriously, when a store man a queue fell under the weight of snow as they were waiting for slow-moving city buses in downtown Knoxville. Broken power lines brought severe discomfort to numerous families depending on electricity for heat as the temperature dropped to 23 degrees this morning. Railroad crews fought against heavy odds to push principal trains through the drifts hours behind schedule. Buses and automobiles were reported stalled along hundreds of miles of highways. One train bringing the University of Kentucky football team here for today's game with the University of Tennessee had to follow a walking signalman for the last 12 miles into the city. The train halted at each signal block while the crewmen worked ahead to the next to shift snow-clogged automatic switches manually. Primary highways were being cleared rapidly today. Briefly, here was the situation in other states: Kentucky—Three to five inches of snow in the southeastern mountains. Football fans advised not to try to make the trip to Knoxville, Harlan and Middlesboro areas isolated. Virginia—Four to 12 inches of snow in southwestern mountains. Telephone and telegraph lines down. Five to six hours delay on telephone calls and similar delays in train schedules. Primary highways clear. Few secondary roads blocked by high water, but no dangerous flood conditions. North Carolina—Communications cleared, but patrolmen advise caution in western region where rain is now freezing. Snow still falling in northwestern counties early today.

Brownell Plans To Study Cases on Federal Docket

NEW YORK (AP)—Herbert Brownell Jr., designated by President-elect Eisenhower as the next attorney general, indicates he will re-examine all criminal and civil cases pending in the Department of Justice when he assumes office. Criminal prosecutions are pending against some key figures in the Truman administration, accused of dereliction of duty, while other investigations may result in actual charges. On the civil side, Brownell presumably will review anti-trust actions involving charges of business monopoly. Asked yesterday whether he planned a reorganization of the department, some of whose activities were under fire during the presidential campaign, Brownell said: "Whatever is necessary to make it efficient and effective will be done and done quickly." Apparently surprised by his selection as attorney general-designate, the 40-year-old Brownell said: "If and when the nomination is confirmed by the Senate, I shall accept with a deep sense of humility, and to the best of my ability shall carry out the President-elect's orders to conduct my office without partiality to any group or section, in fairness and justice to all the people." Brownell said he was withdrawing Dec. 31 from the law firm of Lord, Day and Lord with whom he has been associated for 20 years. Brownell yesterday asked J. Edgar Hoover to stay on the job, and said of the head G-man: "As a long-time admirer of the FBI director, I am looking forward to expanded co-operation between his bureau and all the other law-enforcement agencies of the office of attorney general." Born in Peru, Neb., the son of a college professor, Brownell was graduated from the University of Nebraska at the age of 20. Then came a scholarship to Yale where, three years later, he graduated with a law degree, cum laude. Going to New York City to practice law, Brownell met another young Midwestern lawyer, Thomas E. Dewey. In 1934, he married Doris A. Mc-

West Berlin German Mecca

BERLIN (AP)—In spite of the dangers—and they are very real—West Berlin has become a mecca for German and industrial party rallies and industrial assemblies. Twenty-five major meetings have been held in West Berlin this year. No other city in Germany can compete with surrounded Berlin as an attraction for Germans. It is a symbol of past glory, unity and strength. It stands also as a reminder of the East German front against the Red Army. "Often West Germans ask travelers to take a letter with them for a friend in the Soviet zone. Turn such requests down," the instructions said. Carrying Western newspapers and magazines into the East also is forbidden and even the papers and files to be used in the party meeting itself were ordered sent by air mail. The party leaders say it was necessary for them to spell out such directions. Many Germans still are unable to regard the East zone as other than German territory. Only when they fall into the net, and are treated as foreigners or even alien spies, do they realize that the Elbe-Oder chunk of divided Germany is Communist and Russian. Many West Germans take a chance coming to Berlin for these rallies. The 100 miles of Soviet zone between the west border and the city contain a lot of pitfalls. As a result, various organizations advise their membership on the do's and don'ts of a trip through the East zone to Berlin.
