Businessman Turns Bandit Killed in Robbery Attempt

ST. LOUIS (AP) — While police sought to learn what turned a respected businessman into a bandit, a guard who killed him before being overcome by gas in an attempted armored money truck robbery died Monday.
Thomas F. Doerflinger, the 24-year-old guard, suffered fatal ammonia burns of the face and lungs during the daring, daylight robbery attempt on a busy street Friday. He died in city hospital at 4 a.m.
The amateur holdup man, later identified as Jacob R. Katz, head of an ice cream store chain, sent a scaring stream of gas from a crude, home-made bomb through an opening into the truck's locked money compartment where Doerflinger was on duty alone.
Although blinded, the guard drew his pistol and fired five shots back through the aperture in the rear of the truck cab, killing Katz.
