### Variety Club Adopts Child

**PITTSBURGH (AP)**—The Variety Club, an organization of showmen which has 10,000 members in 49 "units" in all parts of the world, has a new founding today and \$52,000 to help care for many other homeless children.

The \$52,000 was raised in an all-night "teletown" over Dumont television station WDTV in Pittsburgh yesterday.

Last night the club held its silver anniversary banquet. The center of attention was a 10-month-old boy from the Rosella Foundling Home here. The club formally "adopted" him as it has several other children since its organization. And like the others, the youngster will have his expenses and education paid for by the club.

The \$52,000 collected in the "teletown" will be added to another \$90,000 to help build a new wing at the Rosella Foundling Home. The wing, a project of Tent No. 1 here, will cost \$400,000.

### T-H Law May Be Revised

**WASHINGTON (AP)**—Signs on Capitol Hill pointed today to a major rewriting of the nation's labor law by the new Republican 83rd Congress—possibly even junking the Taft-Hartley Act.

Rep. McConnell (R-Pa.), who steps up to the chairmanship of the House Labor Committee in the GOP-controlled Congress, told a reporter:

"We are certainly going to have changes in the labor-management relations law. I certainly anticipate them, but how they will be made I can't yet say."

Sen. Taft (R-Ohio) wants to keep the law that bears his name, but revamp it through a series of amendments.

Strong feeling is reported to exist among some GOP lawmakers for completely rewriting basic labor-management legislation—and in some cases, bury for good the controversial association of Taft-Hartley with the Republican party.

Speculation has also been reported among some labor union officials on the prospect of an entirely new law emerging from the House Labor Committee under McConnell.

As the committee's ranking minority member in the first Congress, McConnell worked out a union safety bill satisfactory to labor, operations and the government after getting all parties around a table to compromise their differences.

McConnell was reported to have in mind the same sort of an approach to working out a new labor-management relations act to take the place of Taft-Hartley.

McConnell, an investment banker and not a lawyer, has never disguised his belief that Taft-Hartley is too legalistic and obscure to be understood readily.

### Lost Child Said Safe

**WASHINGTON, Pa. (AP)**—A 2½-year-old boy who started out to feed the plump turkey destined for his family's Thanksgiving Day dinner and lost himself in rain-swept woods for nearly 24 hours, is safe today in a warm hospital.

George (Butch) Bell of nearby Avella wandered away from his home Saturday. He was clad in blue jeans and a T-shirt.

A search party yesterday found the youngster, soaked from rain and scratched from underbrush, huddled in a dense thicket about 2½ miles from his home.

The boy's 22-year-old mother fainted as she clasped him. She said:

"I got hold of him and held him tight. Then I passed out. I nearly dropped him, I guess."

Doctors at Washington Community Hospital said the boy seemingly is well but detained him for observation.
