SCOTUS Rejects Plea To Dismiss Top Bishop

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Supreme Court Monday struck down as an infringement of religious freedom a New York state law designed to end Communist infiltration into the Russian Orthodox Church in this country.

The same 8-1 ruling held New York could not oust the archbishop of the church despite charges that he was under Russian government domination.

The decision applies to Benjamin Fedchenko, who had been removed from Saint Nicholas Cathedral of the Russian Orthodox Church in North America.

Justice Reed delivered the court's decision. Justice Jackson wrote a dissenting opinion.

Fedchenko is archbishop of the archdiocese of North America and the Aleutian Islands of the Russian Orthodox Greek Catholic Church. He was appointed by the Patriarch of Moscow, the chief authority of the mother church of Russia.

In other actions the high tribunal:

1. Refused to halt the Pittsburgh trial of Communist party organizer Steve Nelson and four other persons on charges of plotting to teach violent overthrow of the U. S. government.
2. Put a fifth school segregation case—this one from Delaware—on its docket and told Kansas "because of the national importance of the issues presented" to say whether it plans to argue the case in which it is involved. All five cases are due to be heard next month.
3. Held 5-4 that minors taken abroad by their parents retain their United States citizenship even though they take an oath of allegiance to a foreign power.

The ruling applied to Joseph Mandoli, who was born of Italian parents in Ravenna, Ohio, on Sept. 17, 1907, and who was taken to Italy when he was only four months old.

Truckers Ask Rate Increase

SALEM (AP) — Oregon's trucking industry asked Monday for an 8 1/2 per cent increase in freight rates, asserting that the truckers are losing money under present rates.

A hearing on the application opened before Public Utilities Commissioner Charles H. Hettzel, and is expected to last until Wednesday. The truckers plan to put about 30 witnesses on the stand.

The 8 1/2 per cent increase would be in addition to the 6 per cent increase granted last Feb. 1.

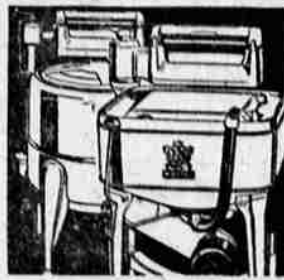
Shippers organizations will appear against the proposed increase, asserting they can't afford to pay the higher rates.

The application was filed by the Pacific Inland Tariff Bureau, which represents most of the state's truckers.

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6. Refused to review a decision invalidating a section of the New York milk order which required that payments be made on "non-pool" milk sold in the area.

The Justice Department had contended the U. S. Circuit Court decision casts a serious cloud on the legality of similar sections in 44 other milk orders.

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Newbury Won't Ask Ruling

DETROIT, Mich. (AP) — If a court ruling is asked on who should be the next governor of Oregon, the request will not be made by Oregon Secretary of State Earl T. Newbury.

That was his statement here Saturday when asked to comment on reports that the State Supreme Court might be asked to rule on whether Newbury or State Sen. Paul Patterson should be governor when Gov. Douglas McKay resigns to become secretary of the interior in President-Elect Dwight Eisenhower's cabinet.

Patterson is expected to get the job because he was president of the Senate at the last session of the State Legislature. But some state officials think Newbury might be entitled to it.

Newbury said the question came up some time ago when McKay was out of the state. Some extra-dition papers were to be signed and Newbury said some of his attorney friends had contended the responsibility for signing them was his, not Patterson's. McKay returned and signed the papers himself, though, Newbury said.

Later, Attorney General George Neuner ruled that Patterson should be acting governor because his term as president of the Senate does not end until a new president is elected and qualified.

Newbury, in this area to attend a meeting of the Motor Vehicle Administrators Association at Chicago, said of McKay's appointment:

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
