## Youth Gets Life Sentence

EUGENE (AP) — Billy Edwards, 17, will go to prison under sentence of life for the slaying of his 73-year-old grandmother last month.  
 The sentence is mandatory for a guilty plea to a second degree murder charge. He made that plea Monday and was to start prison after sentencing Tuesday.  
 He was indicted on a charge of first degree murder in the death of Mrs. Maude E. Wood whose body was found in her burning home. But after a psychiatric examination, his attorney and the district attorney agreed to the lesser charge. Results of the examination were not revealed.  
 Billy pleaded innocent to the first degree murder charge. But when it was reduced to second degree he changed his plea to guilty.  
 The grandmother had been hit and strangled, an autopsy revealed. Her purse was missing.

## Ike Asked To Visit India

NEW DELHI, India (AP) — "Strong recommendations" have been sent to U. S. President-elect Eisenhower that he visit India enroute home from Korea, it was reliably learned here today.  
 These recommendations, from a high diplomatic level, argued that such a visit would end apprehensions among the Indians that the Republican victory foreshadowed a change in U. S. policy toward this country.

 Four others escaped when the big four-engine plane plunged into Boone's creek at the mouth of Bush River shortly after takeoff from the Army Chemical Center airfield here.

 Heirs of John McCormack, the famous Irish-American tenor who died in 1945, are negotiating with a major studio on the film rights of his life story. The "great singers" cycle, started by the Caruso biography, is in full blossom in Hollywood, with the Marjorie Lawrence and Grace Moore films due for immediate filming.
