Only three members of the Council—Wendell Smith, John McCulloch and Don Kenyon—were present for last night's brief session. Both Mayor Bob Thompson and Ward 3 Councilman Mark Smith were out of town.

Mayor Thompson may appoint someone to replace Miller for the balance of this year, but the incoming mayor, Paul Landry, will have the job of selecting a Ward 4 councilman to serve until the 1954 general election.

Miller was re-elected at the Nov. 4 general election.
