NORTH PT. HOOD, Tex. (AP)—A frail New Mexico mother said a prayer of thanksgiving today for the men of the Fourth Training Company here.

The men of the company—all on private pay—dug deep in their pockets for nickels, dimes and dollars to finance a trip for Mrs. Refugio Gonzales to spend Thanksgiving with her son, Pvt. Pedro Lopez.

Today she and her 20-year-old

son were special guests of the Ft. Hood soldiers.

Pedro has been in the Army only a few months, but it has been a long time for Mrs. Gonzales. It is the longest period that mother and son have been apart.

Pedro listed his occupation simply as "cotton picker" when he was called into service. But he was the sole support of his mother and tended their quarter-acre of land near Mesilla, N. M.

Today's visit was made possible because Mrs. Gonzales appreciated a simple form letter mailed her by Ft. Hood officials. It bore the signature of Maj. Gen. Bruce C. Clarke, Ft. Hood commander, and said he was "pleased to inform you that your son has arrived at Ft. Hood for training with the famed First Armored Division."

The letter urged Mrs. Gonzales to write her son often and welcomed her to visit him.

Mrs. Gonzales answered immediately. She told the general she was glad her son was in good hands. She said she had been wanting to visit Pedro since the

Ambassador Resigns

WASHINGTON (AP)—Stanley Woodward Wednesday submitted his resignation as ambassador to Canada. It is effective Jan. 15.

Woodward, former State Department protocol chief, is widely known in diplomatic circles around the world.

In his resignation, sent to President Truman, a close personal friend, he said:

"After 25 years in the foreign service and State Department, the time has come to return to private life and to assume the responsibilities and privileges of citizenship in our great country."

Truman sent Woodward a message saying that accepting the resignation "stirs my heart and mind with deep emotion."

"I regret that the time has come for you to take such action," Truman said, adding he wished to express his "gratitude for your outstanding contribution as chief of our mission in Canada."

American Pays King's Check

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—A San Francisco man has paid the \$232.88 bill incurred at Hutton's Restaurant in Hollywood last September by King Fahal II of Iraq and 30 retainers.

The owners, George and Joe Hutton, waited a discreet time, then presented their bill to the State Department, but since the luncheon wasn't arranged by anyone in the U. S. diplomatic corps, the official reaction was quite cool.

The Huttons said they have received a letter and check from George Adelson in San Francisco, reading in part:

"I thought if you had my check and cashed it at once, this matter would be hushed up and we would save the face of the American people for the blunder of the State Department, which made a very undiplomatic error."

The Huttons cashed the check.

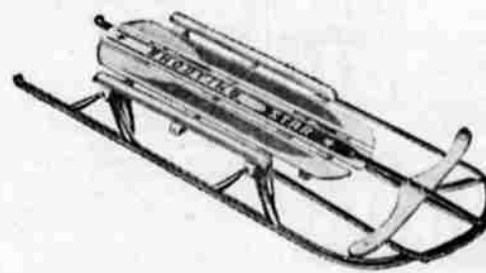

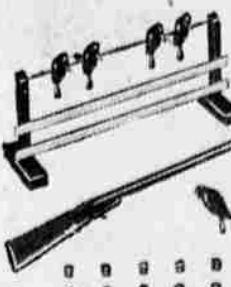

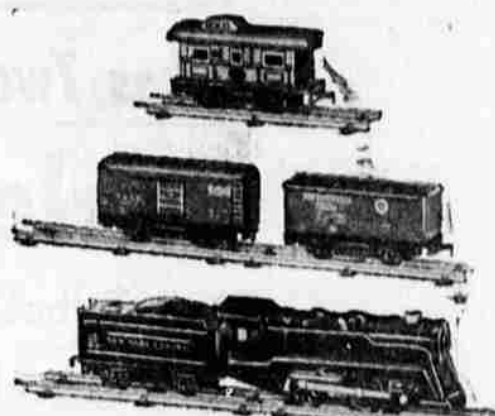

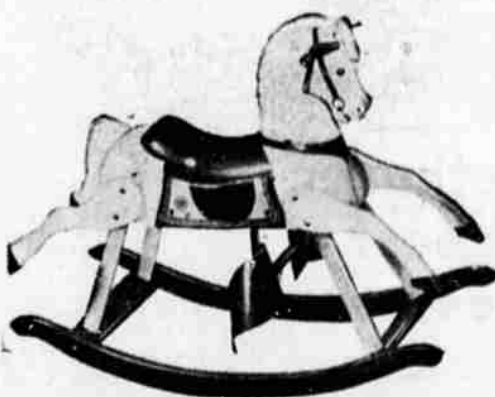
