It would simply be a case of homesteaders being willing to assume all risks of having their land and homes flooded when unusually wet seasons occur.

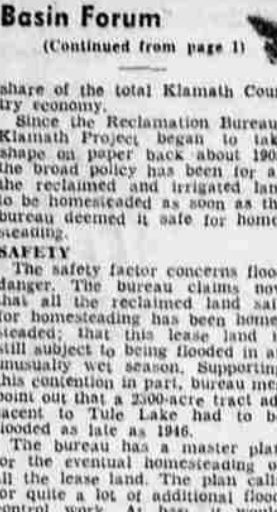

ALTURAS — The Modoc County Board of Supervisors yesterday rejected a petition by residents of an approximate four-square mile area north of Road 10 near Tululeka to pull out of the Newell Union School District and join the Tululeka elementary district.

Board Rejects School Change — According to Superintendent Jim Stearns, four reasons were listed by the board in turning down the petition, which was opposed by a counter-petition at the hearing: 1. Location of the Federal Prison Camp at Newell did not concern children attending the Newell school, one of the reasons for the withdrawal petition.

Board Rejects School Change — 2. The area would force a duplication of bus routes through the school districts.

Board Rejects School Change — 3. Loss of assessed valuation in case of withdrawal would harm the rest of the Newell district.

Board Rejects School Change — 4. Half of the residents of the area, who filed the counter-petition, constituted more than half the children in the area, according to checks made by the board.
