Bonanza Fire Vote Slated

An election has been called for Jan. 16 at Bonanza to ratify or veto the formation of a Bonanza rural fire protection district.

Formation of such a district was suggested in October by petition of a number of residents of the Lost River area, and the County Court yesterday called the election.

Legal voters living within the boundaries of the proposed district may ballot, voting yes or no on the proposition of forming the legal municipality and to choose directors who will serve if the district is created.

Persons expecting to be candidates for the directorships must file nominating petitions with county Clerk Charlie Delap within the next few days to get their names on the printed ballot.

If created, the district will be similar to the Suburban, Stewart-Lenox, Merrill and Mallin rural fire protection districts in that it can

levy property taxes to maintain fire fighting equipment and a regular fire department.

The proposed district covers about 59 square miles, including the communities of Bonanza and Dairy. The Western boundary is a half mile west of Dairy, running two miles north and four south; the Eastern boundary is four miles east of Bonanza; the Southernmost boundary is three and a half miles south of Bonanza.

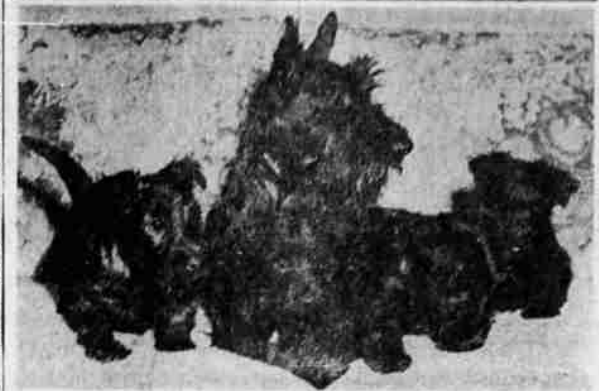
A map showing the boundaries of the proposed district will be printed in the Herald and News prior to the election.
