Pan American said, regarding part of the complaint, that many of the persons who were carried on Pan American they had been offered similar transportation by competing air carriers and planned to accept the offers unless Pan American obliged.

Waksman Collects Prize

STOCKHOLM, Sweden (AP)—Dr. Selman A. Waksman, director of the Institute of Microbiology at Rutgers University in New Brunswick, N. J., arrived by air last night to collect the 1952 Nobel Prize in medicine.

The co-discoverer of the wonder drug streptomycin will receive a \$33,037.59 cash award and a diploma from King Gustav Adolf at a ceremony at the Stockholm Concert Hall next Wednesday.

The Russian-born American scientist will attend the opening of the first Swedish streptomycin factory the same day and two days later will deliver the traditional "Nobel lecture" before the Carolin Institute of Medicine.

He and his wife, who accompanied him here, are scheduled to leave Stockholm for Tokyo Dec. 14. In Japan, Dr. Waksman will deliver the main lecture at the Japanese Congress of Microbiology.

That's what happens when I watch Charlton Heston and Susan Hayward playing Andrew and Rachel Jackson in Fox's "The President's Lady."

All morning the stars have been playing a smooch sequence and now Director Henry Levin moves them to a river flatboat set for more torrid love-making against a background of grain and sheep skins.

But Susan groans:

The kisses are warm, but can't you do something about this cold floor?

The prop man goes for an electric blanket to warm up Susan's feet, which are out of camera range.

Maybe the marriage between Hollywood and TV hasn't taken place yet, but they're sleeping in the same bed.

All eyes, including those of Jane Wyman, Ray Milland and Aldo Ray, are on Valerie Bettis on the "Love Song" set at Columbia. Super-sexy Valerie is doing a native African dance — censors, where are you? — with four male dancers. Her costume consists of net and monkey fur.

While Jane is huddling with Director Oscar Saul on her entrance in the scene, I hear Valerie about, "Sew me up!"

When a lass makes that request in Hollywood, it doesn't mean that she's busted her leg. It means she's popping out of her costume!

"It should," says Noreen, "Virginia Mayo wore it in 'She's Working Her Way Through College.'"

It's all tongue in cheek at Columbia where Producer Sam Katzman is kidding the swash-buckler cycle with "Siren of Baghdad," an oriental opus.
