DETROIT (AP)—Benjamin Krause, 84-year-old widower, took it philosophically today when he learned that Mrs. Esther Gant, 67, had decided at the last minute not to marry him because her children objected.
 Krause, a retired butcher, has been married twice before and has seven sons and three daughters, 24 grandchildren and 30 great-grandchildren. He already had obtained a marriage license when his intended bride changed her mind.
 "I'll ask Mrs. Gant again," he said. "If she refuses, I'll find someone else."

Barracks Fire Kills 5 Men

RAPID CITY, S. D. (AP)—Five Air Force officers were killed yesterday in a fire that raced through a two-story frame barracks at the Rapid City Air Force Base.
 Six other officers were burned and one of them, 2nd Lt. John Rycroft, Yonkers, N. Y., broke an ankle in a leap from a second story window. He and 2nd Lt. Paul W. Rous of Lockbourne Air Force Base, Ohio, were flown to Denver for treatment at Fitzsimmons military hospital. The other four were less seriously hurt.
 The victims were among a group of officers assigned to temporary duty with the 72nd Strategic Reconnaissance Wing. Rapid City is a major base for 336 intercontinental bombers.
 Three of the dead were identified by the base public information officer at 1st Lt. Jerome A. Weinsbank, Kansas City, legal officer at the base; 2nd Lt. Robert W. Wooten Jr., March Field, Calif.; and 2nd Lt. Joseph J. Arsenault, Paul W. Beers, Benicia, Calif., Arsenault's name of the other two victims were withheld pending confirmation of notification of their next of kin.

Indian Raps Yalu Bombings

PHILADELPHIA (AP)—The power plants along the Yalu River were bombed by U. N. airmen last summer at a "tragic time," the Indian delegate to the U. N., V. K. Krishna Menon, said yesterday.
 He said the bombing raids came when "we were just on the point of reaching an agreement." He did not elaborate on that statement.
 Menon was interviewed by a panel of four college and university students on a radio and television program, "Junior Press Conference" (ABC).
 Menon said his country was opposed to the bombing of the power plants because it extended the area of the war and threatened Manchuria.
 Asked if he thought it was possible to negotiate with the Communists, the Indian delegate replied, "why not? It is possible to negotiate with anyone."

Oldest Puma Dies in Zoo

AUCKLAND, New Zealand (AP)—A 22-year-old puma—believed to be the world's oldest in captivity—died today in the Auckland Zoo.
 Zoo authorities decided in 1948 that the spotted panther should be destroyed because she was feeble, but reports in American newspapers that she was to die brought so many appeals from U. S. animal lovers that she was granted a reprieve. Two years later, after an operation to remove a throat abscess, she recovered rapidly. She died finally from liver trouble.

Republicans Flooded With Letters From Job Seekers

By JOE HALL - WASHINGTON (AP)—Offices of Republican senators are being swamped with letters from job seekers eager to get on the federal payroll after 20 GOP years in the political wilderness.
 The senators say they are amazed. They had not looked for such a rush in a time of generally booming business.
 Many of the senators say privately they are sure most of the would-be federal employees are going to be disillusioned—not only with the limited number of job openings but also with the pay and qualifications.

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP)—Detectives grimly searching for the mangled body of a victim who had been run over by a freight train, were flabbergasted yesterday when the "body" suddenly rose from between the rails and asked what all the commotion was about.
 The train had been uncoupled to retrieve the remains of Arthur E. Tarver, 33, over whose body seven freight cars had passed.
 But Tarver explained, "I just laid there until the cars passed over me."
 Hospital attendants said the cut on Tarver's head was minor.
