FDA Studies Ice Cream

WASHINGTON (AP)—Should the fat content of ice cream be reduced? That is one of the questions now before Food and Drug Administration (FDA) officials considering establishment of standards for ice cream and frozen dairy desserts.

Dr. D. B. Hand, chairman of the committee on milk of the Food and Nutrition Board of the National Research Council, speaking for the board, told one of the ice cream hearing sessions in testimony made available to a reporter Monday that from a nutritional standpoint low-fat ice cream is more desirable than a high-fat product.

But under questioning Dr. Hand said it would be the consensus of the committee on milk that it would

be desirable to encourage high fat products and to substitute low fat products for them.

He said it was the committee's view that there should be "encouragement of consumption" and of the desirability of consumption of nonfat milk solids. Nonfat milk solids formerly were called dried skim milk.

Dr. Hand, who is head of the Division of Food Science and Technology at the New York State College of Agriculture at Geneva, N. Y., said in a board statement introduced as testimony at the FDA hearing:

"An ice cream containing 10 per cent fat and 10 per cent nonfat milk solids is nutritionally more desirable than one containing 12 per cent fat and 8 per cent nonfat milk solids."
