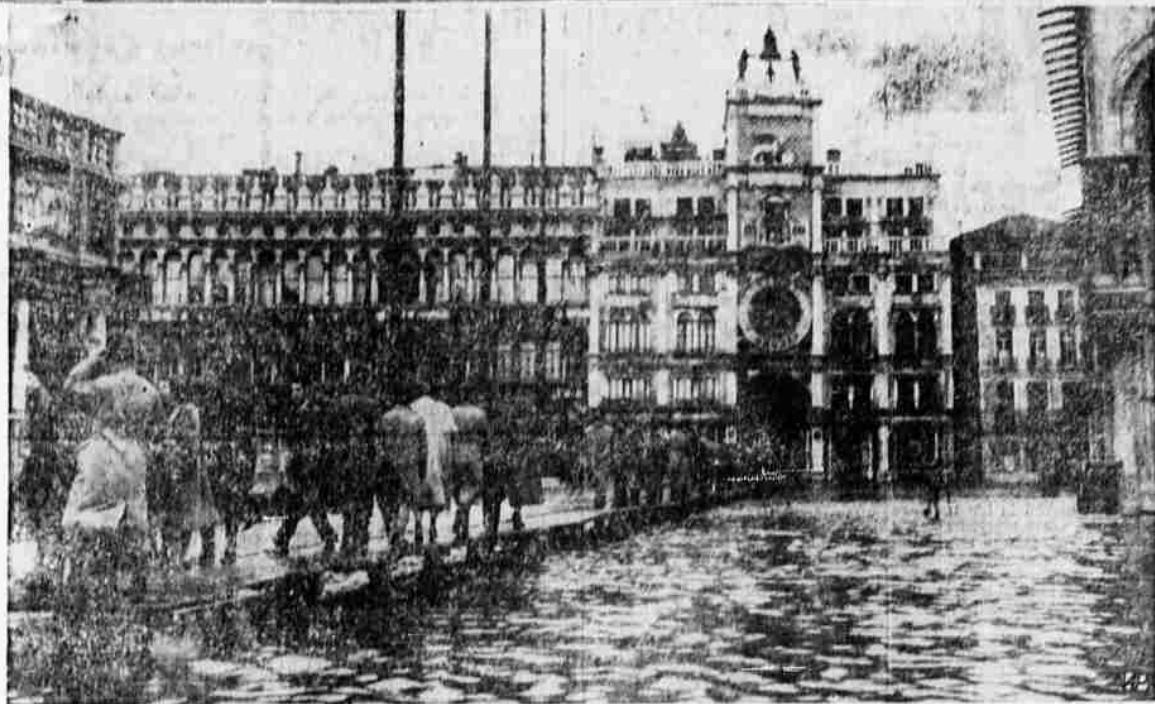




BRIDGING A WATERY GAP. Pedestrians in Venice use an improvised footbridge to cross famed San Marco Square when

Wood River Valley Hard Hit By Weekend's Wintry Storm

UNPREPARED
 The storm caught everyone more or less unprepared, but especially the Modoc Lumber Co., at Seven Mile, as all its snow removal equipment was elsewhere at the time. However, Tuesday afternoon, Don Veatch, logging superintendent of the company, is bringing a Caterpillar from Chinichain, and the road to the camp will probably be cleared of snow this afternoon. On the secondary state highway at Crystal, 12 miles from here, the few families living there have also been incommunicado during the storm and are still snowed in at this time (Tuesday afternoon), but state highway men here are trying their best to break through the deep drifts and get the road open. During the worst of the blizzard, the harassed local crew has kept the main highway open by working day and night. Also isolated by the deep snow are Mr. and Mrs. Robert E. Gordon, who live at the Birch Dixon Seven Mile ranch west of here, while to the East, Lorin M. Streeter has been snowed in at his Wood River ranch, where he lives alone since the death of his wife last summer. County crews will in all probability have the lane leading to his ranch cleared of snow in a short while, but at this writing it is snowing hard, although on Monday skies were clear and the sun was shining—a lull in the storm, most likely.

NO MISHAPS
 However, no mishaps have been reported, and for most of us the lack of power meant just minor inconveniences, doing everything the hard way instead of by use of electricity. Major hardships encountered were those of local stockmen who still have cattle in the valley at this time—they were forced to open roads by caterpillar and haul hay to the snowbound cat-tle in the fields. Lloyd Nicholson and William Zumbro have sizeable numbers of feeder cattle here, but all other Wood River valley stockmen have shipped their cattle elsewhere for the winter months, with the exception of a few head remaining at local ranches.

Monday was a gala day for children of the community, when hand-out ice cream supplies were handed out to youngsters here by grocers and others handling it. Owners of deep freezers here were especially glad to see the lights come on on Tuesday, as it saves frozen meats, etc., from thawing and spoiling, which would have been the case in a short while had the electricity remained cut off.

Marooned at the Seven Mile camp of the Modoc Lumber Co., located west of here on a county road off a state secondary highway, have been two families, Mr. and Mrs. Olaf Erickson and Mrs. Elton (Mike) Mikelson and her two young children. Last Thursday, Mikelson sustained a broken ankle when his car wrecked near Shady Pine, and he has been staying in Klamath Falls with relatives since the mishap. He is timekeeper for the company here during the season's logging run, and has been working in the saw-mill office in Klamath Falls since operations shut down at Seven Mile, driving back and forth each day. On Monday afternoon, accompanied by Floyd Boling, who also has been living at the logging camp, Mikelson came here with the intention of going home, but the two men were forced to return to Klamath Falls, where Boling's wife and son Gary, have been

ing forward to informal meetings in which my associates and I may obtain the full benefit of your thinking and experience. With personal regard.

"Eisenhower."
 And here is the answering radio-gram from MacArthur to Eisenhower:
 "For Ike, I have just received your message. I am grateful for your interest in my views concerning solution of the problems involved in the Korean War and the Far East."

"This is especially so because, despite my intimate personal and professional connection and well known concern therewith, this is the first time that the slightest official interest in my counsel has been evidenced since my return. A failure of policy there might

doom indefinitely the progress of civilization.

"A successful solution on the other hand might well become the key to peace in the world. You know, without my saying, that my service is, as it always has been, entirely at the disposition of our country. My best to you, Ike. As always."

"MacArthur."
 MacArthur's proposals 20 months ago included bombing of Red China bases in Manchuria, blockading the Red China coast and amphibious landings on the China mainland by Nationalist forces.

 But MacArthur indicated Friday that changed conditions called for a revised plan. He said public disclosure or discussion now would be improper.

(In Washington, a high Defense Department official said it was MacArthur's duty as a soldier to present the plan through Army channels "without further ado and without making a speech about it.")

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
