

Navy Approves 'Super Plane'

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Navy said today its RTV-1 Super-Comet, which it calls "America's fastest military air transport," has passed nine weeks of grueling strength tests.

To prove the structural strength of the 113-foot-long plane, engineers at the Lockheed Aircraft Corp. factory in Burbank, Calif., loaded the fuselage with lead ingots and added external pressures until the bending forces equalled 175,000 pounds.

The RTV-1 has a turbo-compound engine—a piston engine with a supplementary jet engine using the exhaust gases—which gives it a cruising speed of 340 miles an hour or more, 30 miles an hour better than the regular piston engines.

Army Lifts Burial Ban

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Army has lifted its ban which kept relatives from viewing the bodies of dead servicemen at burial ceremonies at Arlington National Cemetery.

Charles E. Burnett, who resigned as an Arlington Cemetery funeral director in protest to the original order, said: "This is pretty much what I have been fighting for."

The Army, announcing yesterday that it would permit bodies to be viewed at Arlington under certain "very liberal" conditions, said the ban still stands at other military cemeteries because it lacked personnel and facilities to handle the job.

Royalty Lays Xmas Plans

SANDRINGHAM, England (AP) — It will be a homey Christmas for 15 members of Britain's royal family at Sandringham House, the royal country place in Norfolk. Almost everyone will be there from Queen Mary, 85, to 2-year-old Princess Anne.

Plans for the day center on an informal luncheon. After it, the guests will listen to Queen Elizabeth II make her first Christmas broadcast as ruler to the nation and the Commonwealth. The party also will tune in on the world-wide radio linkup preceding her speech.

Then there will be a tea party for the children.

Chief Goes First Class

VANCOUVER, B. C. (AP) — A Northern British Columbia Indian chief believes in doing things in the grand manner.

When a writ of habeas corpus arrived at his small village of Topley ordering him to produce his three grandchildren in a court custody case here, Chief J. Daniel Leon bundled them into a taxicab and set off.

Some 700 miles later the chief got the taxi bill—for \$395.

Actress Reveals Reconciliation

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Actress June McCall said yesterday that she and her husband, film director George Carl Meek, have become reconciled.

"Actually this happened nearly three months ago but we kept it a secret until we were sure that everything would work out," she told newsmen. "It took us some time to reach a happy solution and now we are sure that we have arrived at that."

The Meeks were married in July, 1951, when she was 17 and he 24. They separated a month later and both filed suit for divorce. The actress obtained an interlocutory decree but no final decree will be entered.

ENJOY INEXPENSIVE PRIZE-WINNING ORANGE MARMALADE

It's Easy to Make Anytime with This Simple Recipe

6 Medium Sized Oranges (2 lbs. sliced)
6 Cups Water
1/2 Cup M.C.P. Lemon Juice (About 6 Lemons)
1 Package (3 1/2-oz.) M.C.P. Jam and Jelly Pectin
3/4 Level Cup Sugar
(Measured ready for use)

1. Cut oranges in eighths with very sharp knife to make slices thin as possible. Discard the large flat peel ends. Sliced fruit should weigh 2 pounds.
2. Put sliced fruit in 8-quart kettle. Add the water and lemon juice.
3. Bring to a quick boil, boil gently for 1 hour (uncovered). If peel is not tender in 1 hour, boil until tender.
4. Measure the cooked material. Due to boiling, the volume will be reduced. Add water to make total peel and juice exactly 7 level cups.
5. Put back in kettle. Stir in M.C.P. Pectin; continue stirring and bring to a full boil.
6. Add sugar (previously measured). Stir gently until it has reached a full rolling boil, and BOIL EXACTLY 4 MINUTES. Remove from fire; skim and stir by turns for 3 minutes.
7. Pour into jars. If you use pint or quart jars, seal hot and invert jars on lids until Marmalade begins to set. Then, shake well and set jars upright. This keeps the peel evenly distributed throughout.

This recipe works equally well with Navel Oranges or Valencia. When either variety is overripe and peel is soft, use 3/4 cup lemon juice instead of 1/2 cup. Be sure to discard any seeds. (Cut out and keep this recipe.)
