Brazil Nut 'Dunking' For Entertaining

Well known in the holiday nut bowl Brazil nuts are a versatile "snack" food. They may be served as salted roasted chips. When the thin lengthwise Brazil nut slices are tossed they develop a pronounced richness of flavor. Brazil nuts win use in sandwich and canape fillings because of the taste and texture contrast they offer.

Let guests help themselves at refreshment time by serving brazil along with crackers and potato chips. Then each guest can dip in for his favorite chicken cheese or cream cheese. A sweet spread for open face sandwiches calls for chopped Brazil nuts and strawberry jam. Spread on slices of bread cut with a Christmas tree cookie cutter then trim with cream cheese put through a pastry tube.

BRAZIL NUT CHIPS

1½ cups shelled Brazil nuts
1 teaspoon butter or margarine
1 teaspoon salt

Cover Brazil nuts with cold water and bring slowly to a boil. Simmer 2 to 3 minutes or until nuts can be sliced easily. Drain and cut into ½-inch thick lengthwise slices. Spread out in a shallow pan. Dot with butter. Sprinkle with salt. Bake in moderate oven (350 F.) 10 to 15 minutes stirring occasionally. Yield: Approximately 2 cups.

BRAZIL NUT CHEESE DIP

½ cup cottage cheese
1 3-ounce package cream cheese

Blend together cottage cheese, cream cheese, sour cream and Tabasco. Add salt and Brazil nuts; mix well. Serve with potato chips and crackers. Yield: 1½ cups.

BRAZIL NUT CHICKEN SPREAD

1½ cups chicken ground
¾ cup ground Brazil nuts
¾ cup mayonnaise or salad dressing
1 tablespoon lemon juice
¼ teaspoon salt

Combine all ingredients; pile into serving dish. Serve with crisp crackers or melba toast. Yield: Approximately 2 cups.

BRAZIL NUT CLAM APPETIZER

¼ teaspoon Tabasco
1 3-ounce package cream cheese
1 10½ ounce can minced

clams drained
¾ cup toasted chopped Brazil nuts
Add Tabasco to cream cheese and blend well. Drain clams and add to cream cheese with Brazil nuts. Serve with potato chips and crackers. Yield: Approximately 1 cup.

BRAZIL NUT CONSERVE

Combine 1 cup strawberry or apricot jam or any other favorite nuts. Yield: 1½ cups.

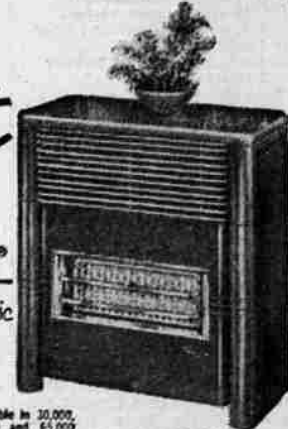

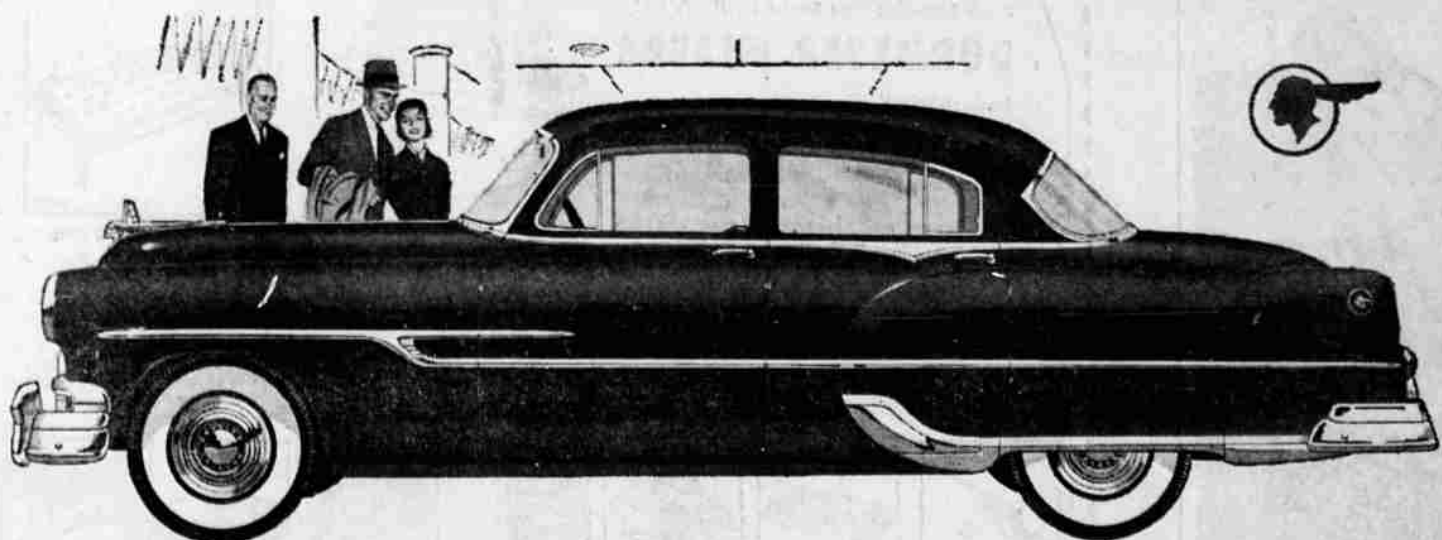
