Phone Rate Boost Asked

Increases in residence telephone rates ranging from 10 cents to 75 cents a month are included in a general repricing application filed by Pacific Telephone Friday with Charles Helzel, Oregon Public Utilities Commissioner.

"The public interest requires us to maintain good communications service. To do so we must maintain our ability to attract new capital from investors. Dollars for telephone plant and apparatus do not come from the money customers pay for telephone service. They come from investors and investors are attracted only by the prospect of reasonable earnings."

For the state as a whole, the overall increase will amount to less than 3 cents a day per telephone or a little over \$320,000 per month. Of this amount the company would collect not less than half because of the federal income tax.

Proposed monthly increases, not counting the federal excise tax, for major types of service in Klamath Falls are as follows: one-party residence, 65 cents; two-party residence, 55 cents; four-party residence, 45 cents; suburban residence, \$1.75.

lived on a ranch in Nevada until they came to Klamath Falls in 1885 settling in the Henley district. Mr. and Mrs. Wilson brought the first poplar trees to the Klamath County, by buckboard from Adele, Calif. Many of these still remain.

Mrs. Wilson bridge on the Merrill Highway is named for them because of Mr. Wilson's interest in good roads and irrigation.

In 1892 the family moved into Klamath Falls where Mrs. Wilson operated the old Linkville hotel. In 1895 they purchased the Ewauna House on Main Street, operating it until Mr. Wilson's death in 1901.

Mrs. Wilson later became the wife of Frank Ward, pioneer businessman of Klamath Falls. They engaged in the fuel business and in real estate with the late Capt. O. C. Applegate. They operated a general store and grocery in the Willis Building and also engaged in the sheep business.

Mrs. Ward has remained interested in the development of this country through her later years and did not become bedfast until about two weeks ago.

Surviving are: son, James Henley Wilson, Bly; two grandchildren, Herbert W. Wilson, Klamath Falls and Mrs. Katherine King, Long Creek, Ore.; two great-grandchildren, Marcia and James Wilson, Klamath Falls and her niece, Mrs. Sally Harshbarger, Henley.

The body is at Ward's Funeral Home and funeral arrangements will be announced later.
