**RECORD SMASHING FIGHTER.** This is the Republic XF-91 interceptor which made the first supersonic, rocket-powered flight ever flown by a U.S. combat-type experimental fighter in tests at the Air Force Test Center, Muroc Lake, Calif. The XF-91 uses two engines, one a 5,200-pound thrust rocket turbojet used to approach the sound barrier. The other is a 6,000-pound rocket engine to ram the plane past the barrier. Torpedo-like objects under wings are spare fuel tanks with fins. Although performance figures are restricted, a supersonic flight is one in excess of 750 miles per hour, speed of sound at sea level.

## Goldwyn Raps Newsmen For Bad H'wood Reports

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—Sam Goldwyn made another speech this week. And when Sam opens his mouth, he usually says something controversial.

The event was the annual Panhandle dinner of the Screen Publicists Guild. That's the one night of the year when the press agents put the newspaper boys and girls on the pan and give them a trying.

Edgar Bergen got into the spirit of things when he introduced his old boss, Goldwyn. That famous woodenhead, Charlie McCarthy, made some sharp cracks and even suggested that Goldwyn's English teacher was a certain edicated horse in Richmond, Va.

Goldwyn got so much amusement out of parts of his own speech that it seemed as though he were reading it for the first time. But he also launched some serious comments on the quality of news and publicity emanating from Hollywood.

"Hollywood is one of the most important places in the world," he announced. "There is no excuse for the mess of phony news that comes out of Hollywood."

He added, "It is hard to blame the public for skepticism over the stories from here." He called on the press agents to "restrain some of the fancier flights of imagination that bring scorn and ridicule on the motion picture industry."

"Hollywood needs good public relations just as it needs good pictures," he continued, calling for a "return to decency and honesty" in publicity.

He closed with the crack that "Samson used only two columns to bring down the house" and suggested that publicity men could do the same.

Goldwyn's remarks bring up an ancient issue in the movie business. Actually, Hollywood is a split personality. Half of it wants to be respectable and honored in the national community. The other half is wedded to the circus and thrives on the ballyhoo that goes with it.

Motion pictures are business. But they are also show business. And the traditional way to get people in to see a show is to beat a drum, blow a whistle and make a spiel.

Whenever business gets bad, Hollywood blames it on public relations. It launches campaigns with slogans like "Motion pictures are your best entertainment" or "Movies are better than ever."

But eventually the town concludes that public relations don't

sell movies. Publicity does the selling job, and all kinds of publicity.
