

## Mother Fails in Giveaway Try

HOLLYWOOD 48 — A stranded Denver mother has learned a hard lesson about Hollywood radio giveaway shows—to win you must first be chosen for the program.

For five years Mrs. Emma Milonovich, 30, has listened to a certain broadcast where winning contestants are awarded lucrative prizes.

So last Saturday she bundled her three children, aged 3, 4 and 5, onto a bus in Denver and headed here. The junket was financed by \$50 from the rent money.

She tried to get on the show both Monday and Tuesday and failed. Meanwhile she had left the children at a nearby rooming house with a note that she hadn't deserted them, but would return as soon as she won something on the show.

Someone saw the note and called police. Officers went to the studio for the mother. She told them she had spent her last money for the children's breakfast and had no money for the return trip to Denver. The family was taken to a rescue mission and arrangements were being made today for the fare.

Mrs. Milonovich said she left a note for her husband, a rubber worker, telling where she was going and mentioning gifts she expected to bring back with her.

## Cop Jailed For Shooting

PENDLETON 48 — Constable Francis A. Huffman, 48, of Athena, is serving 30 days in jail for assault with a deadly weapon.

He was accused of shooting at a motorist, Konrad H. Linke of College Place, Wash., said a man fired two shots at the back of his car after trying to stop him.

The man was dressed in overalls and a straw hat and did not use a siren. Linke, a recent arrival from Germany, said.

Huffman said he fired in the air to stop the car which he said was speeding. But testimony at the trial which closed Monday, showed the bullet had been fired on a horizontal line.

Police Chief Ralph Bond had six Pendleton police department recruits sit through the case which was tried without a jury by Judge R. G. Green of La Grande.

TRAINING URGED  
MANILA 48—House Speaker Eugenio Perez wants the Philippines to revive citizens military training to build up a reserve force of 120,000 men for emergencies. Perez recalled that the late President Manuel Quezon created a big reserve force with a citizens training plan and it was ready when World War II broke out in Asia. The Philippines now train 6,000 youths each year, but Perez wants that stepped up to 10,000.

## Diplomat Goes To Moscow

MOSCOW 48 — Jacob D. Beam, veteran U. S. State Department officer, arrived in Moscow Wednesday to take charge of the American embassy.

Beam will serve as charge d'affaires with the rank of minister counselor.

He formerly held the same position in the American embassy in Belgrade, Yugoslavia.

The Moscow ambassadorship has been vacant since Oct. 3, when the Russians demanded the recall of George F. Kennan on the grounds that the envoy had slandered the Soviet Union by comparing life for Americans in Moscow with the internment he underwent in Nazi Germany after Pearl Harbor.

The United States rejected the Russian charge but had no choice other than compliance with the Russian demand.

Kennan was ordered home for consultation and reassignment.

At the time of Kennan's recall, diplomatic sources in Washington said the State Department still considered him U. S. ambassador to Russia and therefore was not planning any replacement.

All American ambassadors, however, are presenting their resignations in preparation for the inauguration of President-elect Eisenhower.

One of the new administration's early problems thus will be whether to send another top-ranking diplomat to the Russian capital.

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## Atom Scientist In Ministry

OAK RIDGE, Tenn. 48 — Dr. William O. Pollard, atomic scientist and executive director of the Oak Ridge Institute of Nuclear Studies, was ordained into the ministry of the Episcopal church Wednesday.

But Pollard said his decision to enter the ministry had nothing to do with any sense of guilt over the atomic bomb. He will continue his nuclear research.

Pollard's four sons also participated in the ceremony at St. Stephen's Church where the scientist is a parishoner. Grosvenor, 18, and Frank, 11, served as crucifers, and Lewis, 16, and James, 13, as acolytes.

Pollard said many persons assumed erroneously that he had "been driven into the ministry through a sense of guilt or disillusionment."

Others assumed "that I have become convinced that Christianity offers the best of several possible solutions to mankind's problems."

He said neither of these explanations is "at all close."

"Ultimately, it goes back to the influence of my wife in her insistence we should have a Christian marriage and bring up our children in a Christian environment," he said.

"I do believe deeply that the dominant secular humanist tone of our current culture is profoundly false and a mortal sin against God, literally change this condition, and 'But I cannot believe that my taking holy orders will alone make the cause of my action.'"

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
