

### Couple Fete 73rd Anniversary

LOMA LINDA, Calif. (AP)—Mr. and Mrs. William W. Lambeth are celebrating their 73rd wedding anniversary today—a little quietly. They're still a bit tuckered from observing his 101st birthday.

On that occasion, Dec. 4, all six children were on hand. There was open house, with friends coming and going, and dinner and a cake. Today there would be a good dinner, at least five of the children present but otherwise "a nice quiet day," said a daughter, Miss Ellen Lambeth.

She said her father, who weighs 113 now, weighed only 70 pounds

when he was 19 years old.

"The doctors thought he had heart trouble. If he did, he outgrew it. They say he has a very good heart now—and the blood pressure of a young man."

The Lambeths, born in different Alabama towns, met and married in Deport, Tex. Lambeth was a cattle rancher in Texas, then Arizona, and later a landscape gardener in Palm Springs, Calif. He worked in his vegetable garden through his 99th year.

Now bedridden most of the time, with impaired vision and hearing, he keeps up with current events by quizzing callers.

His wife Ellen, 94 and blind, is cheerful and manages to be up and around. She likes music. Their Christmas gifts will include a record player with both musical records and the talking kind that relate books and current events to the blind.

The recipe for a long marriage? Miss Lambeth, a retired school teacher who lives with her parents, said:

"They say it comes from healthful living, trusting in God and loving each other."

They have 10 grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.

**PIGEONS GET 'HOT FOOT'**  
NEW YORK (AP)—The best way to keep pigeons off public buildings is to give them the "hot foot." The British Information Service reports that a slender electric wire is run along ledges on which the birds usually perch. This transmits a weak shock once a second. Any bird coming in contact with the wire usually takes off immediately. A number of large buildings in Birmingham, England, have tried it successfully, according to the report.

### Japan Coal Strike Over

TOKYO (AP)—Most of Japan's 260,000 coal miners returned to work Wednesday, temporarily ending a two-month strike which brought distress to Japanese and foreigners alike.

The miners, members of the Japan Federation of Coal Miners' Unions, obeyed a government injunction ordering a 90-day cooling off period.

The newspaper Asahi reported the union decided to accept a compromise plan suggested by the government Central Labor Relations Board.

If management also accepts the plan, which calls for a 7 per cent pay raise and a 15 bonus, the coal dispute may be settled. The miners demanded that their \$1.52 daily pay be hiked to \$2.94.

Kyodo News Service reported 70 to 80 per cent of the miners returned to work.

### Committee Hears Importer

WASHINGTON (AP)—Alfred Kohlberg, New York importer who has been linked to the China lobby, appears today before House investigators, presumably to discuss the Institute of Pacific Relations.

Kohlberg is the only scheduled witness for today's open hearing of a special House committee which is trying to determine whether any funds of tax-free institutions have been used for subversive purposes.

The "China lobby" is a term generally applied to those urging congressional approval of more aid to Chiang Kai-shek's Nationalist government.

The IPR has been mentioned frequently in committee hearings as having received large grants to conduct research on the Far East. The institute and several of its prominent members have been under strong congressional fire in probes of communism. The organization has denied that it was controlled by Communist sympathizers.

Owen Lattimore, a Far East expert active in IPR affairs, was indicted by a federal grand jury yesterday on seven counts alleging perjury, including one that he lied when he said he had never been a Communist promoter or sympathizer.

Kohlberg, a wealthy textile im-

porter, told a Senate committee last April that he belonged to the IPR for many years but resigned in 1947. The reason, he said, was that IPR officials refused to investigate his contention that Communists were gaining control. Congress has been told the investigation subsequently was made.

The IPR is a nonprofit organization which its officials say is concerned solely with research on the Far East.
