One of the target rifles stolen last week from the YMCA has been returned.

Martha Blair, Y secretary, said a local farmer, who wished to remain anonymous, brought the .22-cal. Remington in and reported that an employee on his farm had found it near the S. 6th viaduct. Still another .22 target rifle, a Winchester, is missing.

Both were taken Wednesday of last week from the YMCA building by two boys who had slipped out of the juvenile home. The boys, caught later, said they hid the guns underneath the S. 6th Street viaduct that same afternoon. When they were sent to bring in the guns, they were gone.
