

### Dog Nabs Crazy Man

LONDON (AP)—An alert police dog nabbed a demented man early today as he invaded Buckingham Palace grounds.

Guards said the dog, Bruce, grabbed the man, 27, just as he dropped over a brick wall bordering the north side of the palace grounds. Bruce's handler responded to the dog's barking and took the man into custody.

The man was taken to a hospital for further observation.

### Cows May Kill Bugs

WASHINGTON (AP)—Tomorrow's dairy cow may do her own insect killing. So may other farm animals.

The Agriculture Department reported today it is testing a method of injecting farm animals with insecticides.

Once injected under the skin of the animal, the insecticide is carried through the bloodstream to all parts of the animal's body.

A fly or mosquito that pierces the animal's skin in an attempt to feed on its blood is dosed with the insecticide and dies.

The department said a chemical called lindane is the only insecticide found effective under the method.

The department emphasized, however, that the research has not advanced far enough to consider practical use of this method yet.

### Florida Cold Spell Eases

MIAMI, Fla. (AP)—Florida's longest cold spell of the year showed signs of moderating today after three nights of freezing or near freezing temperatures.

The state's multimillion-dollar citrus crop, now rolling to market, apparently was unharmed but tender vegetables in the Everglades suffered some frost damage.

Miami reported a low of 41 degrees and frost reached far down the peninsula.

No frost damage was seen for Friday and Saturday mornings, the frost warning service said.
