Earth Slide Fatal to Man

THE DALLES — A bank of earth collapsed Wednesday afternoon and claimed the first victim of construction of the Dalles bridge across the Columbia River.

The earth, on the Washington side of the river, went down as Arthur J. Ziesner, 25, of The Dalles, was standing on it. He was unconscious although buried only to his chest, and fellow employees thought he might have struck his head on a portable drilling rig in falling. After 35 minutes of resuscitation effort, a physician pronounced him dead.

He was a recent arrival from Kallspeil, Mont.

Canada Ship Lands Safely

VANCOUVER, B. C. — A crippled Canadian freighter and a big coastal salvage ship Friday won a battle against the elements—but not in time to give the crew members Christmas Day ashore.

The freighter, the Canadian Pacific "Bismarck," Manicouev, under tow of the tug Island Sovereign, reached Race Rocks, at Victoria, at 9 a. m. Friday.

She had been battered by giant seas in three storms since last Thursday when a damaged rudder left the ship out of control.

The Island Tug and Barge salvage vessel took the freighter in tow late Thursday while she was still about 100 miles offshore.

The "Bismarck" was in the Pacific, 1,200 miles west of the B. C. coast, when the trouble developed and Capt. R. A. Leicester of Vancouver radioed the report to company offices at Vancouver.

Still under tow of the Island Sovereign, the "Bismarck" passed Victoria and is continuing on toward Vancouver where she is now expected to arrive between 5 p. m. and 6 p. m., Friday.

The testimonial dinner is to be strictly informal and there is no planned program. Friends of Thompson's who conceived the dinner said the evening would be devoted principally to fun. It is not to be a gala affair and there will probably be about as many women as men attending.

Youth Still Unconscious

Eighteen-year-old Gary Hansen, Yakima, Wash., was still unconscious in Klamath Valley Hospital at noon today, 160 hours after he was injured in an auto accident early last Friday night.

The boy has a skull fracture and severe concussion, along with other injuries.

He was one of seven boys hurt when two cars collided above Collier Park on U.S. 97. Two others also remain in the hospital.

Tom Murdock, 18, of 4079 Shasta Way, Klamath Falls, is still in serious condition from injuries he sustained in the accident, and chi doctor of one of the cars, Delno Dean Hays, 18, Yakima, also is hospitalized.

In his socks they found five small bars of gold.

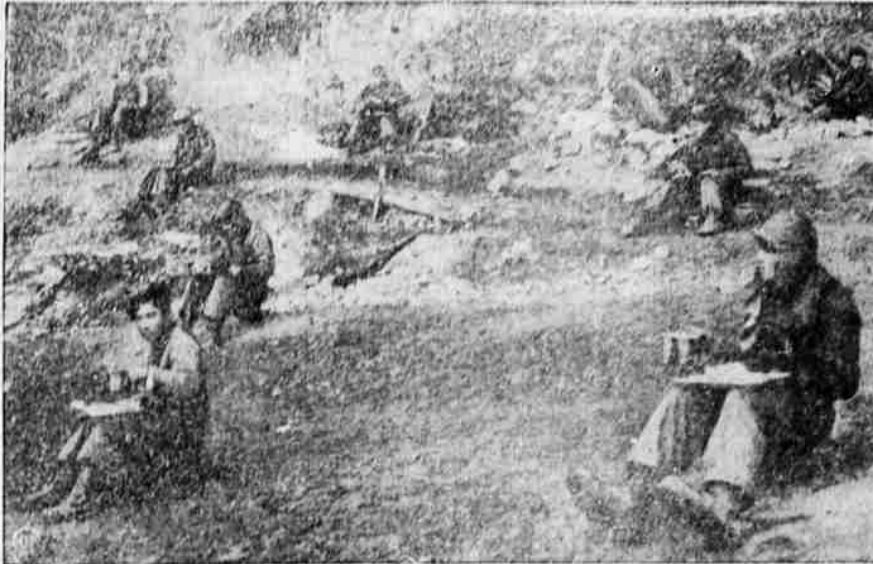
TRIP FOR PRINCE

Grandma May Be Double

LOS ANGELES — There's possibly another grandma bank bandit at large in the Los Angeles area.

The distressing news that two grandmotherly women may have been holding up bank tellers here in recent months developed Thursday when grandma No. 1, Miss Ethel Arata, 52, arrested Christmas Eve when she tried to rob a bank in nearby Arcadia, could not be identified by one of the tellers.

"She doesn't seem to be the same woman who held me up," said Miss June North of the Union Bank & Trust Co., who was robbed of \$2,500 by a gray-haired pistol-packing grandma Nov. 12.

Mrs. Arata has steadfastly denied she robbed the Union bank. Police say she admitted she stuck up branches of the California bank Oct. 17 and the Citizens National Bank Nov. 26, getting a total of \$1,400.

Detectives were inclined to believe Mrs. Arata's story of the two holdups and her denial of the other, but Miss North will see her in a police lineup next Monday night, just to make certain.
