Church Makes Two Branches

The territory of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints has been divided into two branches to alleviate crowded conditions at the church building. Home and Martin and plans are being made to erect a new church later somewhere in the suburban area.

The east branch will encompass all the area east of Washburn with the exception of the federal housing units, and the city remains in the west branch.

Dr. Harold Catmull is president of the west branch, with Clifford Lawrence and Raymond Hawkins as counselors. Ronald E. Phair is president of the east branch, with Wesley Clark and Jack Hallmark as counselors.

Church services are being staggered to accommodate members from both sections. West branch Sunday School will be held at 10 a.m. and the east branch Sunday School is at 11 a.m. Evening service for the west branch will be at 8:30 p.m. and for the east branch at 7:30 p.m.

A reorganization of the church is to take place at a meeting of the membership at Medford Jan. 18. The Klamath and Rogue River districts are to be taken out of the Northern California mission and combined into one stake, which is anticipated to include Klamath Falls, Medford, Grants Pass, Alturas, Tulelake and other towns and communities in this general area.

Phair said that there are about 3,500 members of the Latter Day Saints church in Southern Oregon.

Four Drown As Rescue Fails

CLARKSBURG, Va., (AP) - A 33-year-old man and three youngsters he tried to save drowned in the icy waters of nearby Hinkle Lake yesterday.

The children, who had been ice skating, were Taylor L. McCausland, 9, Eddie Merchant, 10, and John Carlin, 12, all residents of neighboring Bridgeport.

Leonard Jeffries was the passer-by who made the heroic attempt to rescue them when they fell through the ice. He had just been released from the hospital last week following surgery.

David Saunders, another of five boys who had been skating on the thin ice, told police he and Jimmie Gullick tried to shove a log toward their struggling companions but were unable to reach them.

They spotted Jeffries who was driving by en route to his home. Jeffries plunged into the icy water, but in his weakened condition was pulled under by the three terrified boys.

Women Snub Bank Robbers

LOS ANGELES (AP) - Women tellers in Los Angeles County banks are showing a total disregard for the demands of robbers.

One of them helped capture the "grandma" bandit recently, and Rosemary Cocco foiled a man who tried yesterday to hold up a branch Bank. Miss Cocco turned to a woman in the cage next to her and said: "This fool is trying to hold me up; kick the alarm."

The man, who had signed his holdup note "Wild Bill," retreated to the double, but police and FBI agents later arrested Alfred Boyd and booked him on suspicion of robbery.

Pigeon Flies To Queen

HULL, Eng. (AP) - A carrier pigeon has brought Queen Elizabeth II a New Year's message from a British trawler en route to the Arctic Ocean area to fish.

The pigeon landed here yesterday after flying more than 100 miles from the trawler Cape Sparlet. The message was relayed to the Queen who radioped her thanks to the crew of the fishing craft.

Duke Kills Pheasants

SANDRINGHAM, Eng. (AP) - The sharpshooting Duke of Edinburgh and six other hunters bagged nearly 600 pheasants yesterday the biggest one-day score so far this season on this royal estate.

The duke, husband of Queen Elizabeth II, has arranged more than 20 shooting expeditions during the royal family's winter holiday here.

The 800 birds went to waste. Surplus game was sent to a deep freezing plant for the staffs of the royal household. If there is too much for the chamber maids, stable boys and hundreds of others who have to be fed here and at other royal establishments, the excess is sent to hospitals.

Man Jailed For Son's Truancy

WOLVERHAMPTON, Eng. (AP) - Thomas Haynes drew a month jail sentence last night for failing to make his son, Peter, go to school.

Justice Kenneth Wood said Haynes had been fined five previous times for his son's truancy.

"You and all other parents have got to learn there comes a time when prison sentences will be imposed," the judge added.

Peter's punishment—if any—was not disclosed.

'Seven Year Itch' Play Problem for Movie Man

HOLLYWOOD—(NEA) - Exclusively Yours' Vanessa Brown and Tom Ewell will do the film version of their Broadway comedy hit, "Seven Year Itch," if producer Alex Gottlieb succeeds in buying the movie rights. But first Gottlieb has to come up with a treatment that will pass the film censors—and that could take seven years.

LOS ANGELES (AP) - Mrs. Wanda Mary Crowe says she suffered the tortures of hell in a Russian concentration camp, but that her husband, Daniel, treated her worse. The 25-year-old Polish war bride sued for separate maintenance yesterday.

She said her husband, a 37-year-old furrier, demanded that she kiss his feet before giving her money to buy food and forced her to sleep on the floor at the foot of his bed.

Mrs. Crowe identified herself as the daughter of Marjans Bauwinski, former police chief of Warsaw who was executed by the Russians for children. The case was heard in Iran in 1946.

Mrs. Crowe said her husband's behavior was so bad she committed herself to a hospital for the last three months. Mrs. Crowe is acting as her own attorney.

Next spring Mrs. Crowe says she will have held their marriage in Tampa, Fla.

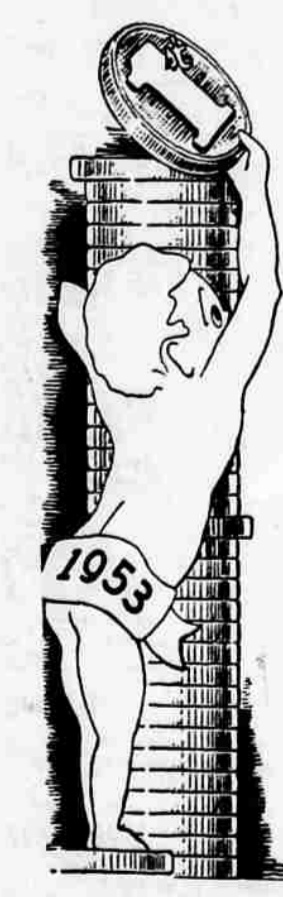
