Chief Reports Fire Losses

City Fire Chief Roy Rowe told the 20-30 Club last night that the city last year chalked up a 27 per cent reduction in fire losses over the previous year.

But the chief warned that there was still plenty of room for improvement.

Addressing the club at a dinner meeting at the Willard Hotel, Rowe explained a number of common fire causes and told how to remedy faults.

He said the rescuator which the Lions Club had given the Fire Department had probably been the means of saving some lives.

The city's new \$35,000 ladder truck will enable firemen to reach the top floor and roof of the Willard Hotel, Rowe said.
