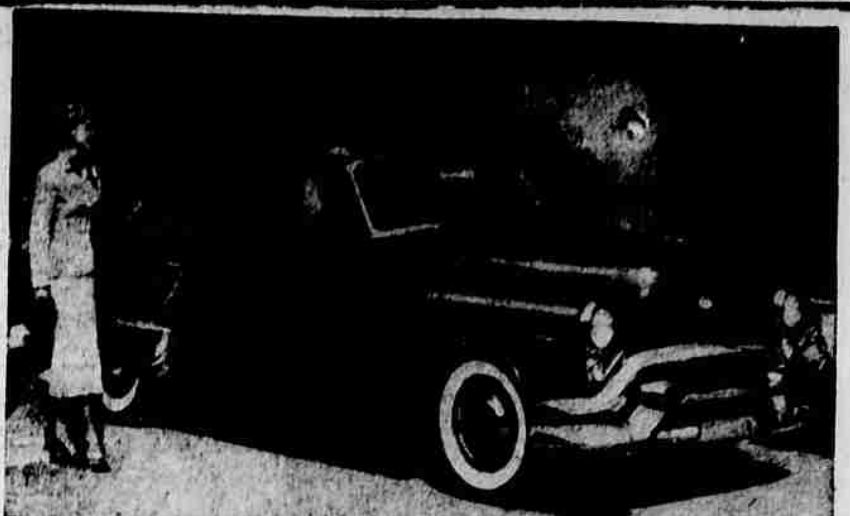

Tax Forms Available

C. D. Roach, district tax administrator for the California State Board of Equalization, Redding District, announced that a supply of Forms BBE 307-A (claim for refund of weight fee credit) and BBE 332-A (subhaul operators statement of weight fees paid) is now on hand and available for distribution to truck operators whose receipts during 1952 resulted from subhaul operations for prime contractors. An amendment to the Motor Vehicle Transportation License Tax Law, effective July 1, 1952, allows refunds of weight fee credits to subhaul operators. Prior to this date operators whose gross receipts were "tax paid" by prime contractors were unable to take advantage of the weight fee credit. Anyone interested in making a claim for refund for the year 1952 should contact the Tulelake Board of Equalization office to obtain forms and further details.

More Duck Hunters Here

Apparently there were more duck hunters in this area this year than last year. Figures released this morning by Postmaster Chet Langslet showed 5,825 migratory wildlife stamps were peddled through local postoffices during the recently concluded duck and goose season. That's 308 more than the 5,517 stamps sold here during the 1951 season. Receipts for last month totaled \$90,675.02, up 4.7 per cent over the same month a year ago. UN Position Resigned By Former Red

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. (AP)—A high U. N. official, admittedly a onetime American Red underground worker and currently a target for U. S. loyalty probes, has quit his post. He is the second American in two days to resign to save the U. N. from "embarrassment."

David Zablodowsky, 48, handed in his resignation late yesterday to U. N. Secretary General Trygve Lie—one day after David Weintraub quit his job as director of the U. N. Division on Economic Stability and Development. Both men were on a U. S. State Department list of 11 American U. N. employees labeled as "communists or under Communist discipline."

"Ever since the recent outbreak of sensational publicity given to certain events in my remote past, I have been as much concerned over the effects upon the United Nations as upon me personally. Though these events have been given an entirely unwarranted coloring by the climate of these times and, though I know myself morally not to blame for being thus used to hurt the (U. N.) organization, I have perforce also known that it always lay in my power to relieve somewhat the pressure and embarrassment on the United Nations by voluntarily severing my relations with it."

Man Killed In Auto Plunge

YREKA—Gus R. Johnson 77, a resident of Elk Creek, was found dead Tuesday afternoon in the wreckage of his automobile which had plunged over a 150-foot embankment on the Elk Creek road near Happy Camp.

Zablodowsky, \$10,800-a-year director of the U. N. Documents and Publications Division, admitted last fall to the McCarran Senate subcommittee that he served in a Red underground in the 1930s with Whittaker Chambers, chief witness against Alger Hiss. He insisted, however, that he had severed all Communist connections shortly after his service with Chambers.

"LOYAL"
Zablodowsky's statement added that "I know myself to have been completely and unequivocally loyal" to both the U. S. government and the U. N. during 19 years of "faithful civil service."

The scene of the accident was some 20 miles from where an automobile carrying 11 persons, all Indians and residents of Happy Camp, plunged into the Klamath River last Saturday.

It was reported here that a new U. S. grand jury, which convened behind closed doors in New York last Tuesday to take up anew the question of alleged American Communists employed by the U. N., was probing again into the Weintraub and Zablodowsky cases.

Lie answered that he appreciated Zablodowsky's motives for quitting and praised his work with the U. N. Lie's reply to Weintraub was in a similar vein.

Johnson was alone in his car. The car tracks were noticed by a woman who went for help and directed a Forest Service crew to the scene to recover Johnson's body.

Weintraub denounced as "outrageously false" the allegations that he was disloyal to the U. S. or had any Communist links.

Zablodowsky's letter to Lie said:
