Those on the council will be Joseph Mercer, George Reed and Bill Lorenz, for one year terms; Dwight Kitcher, John Manning and Fred Markwardt for two year terms.

Mrs. Bertha McCain was reappointed as clerk of the municipal water district by the new mayor. Lewis Jones will continue as chief of police. The position of day officer who also oversees street maintenance was vacated late last week and Chipman asked and received permission of the council to fill the post himself. His duties as mayor are to preside over council meetings, represent the town officially, and to manage the municipally owned beer store.

Deep Snow At Sand's Flat

MT. SHASTA — Snow depth at Sand's Flat as recorded in the first 1953 snow survey recently conducted by Forest Service officers is 106.7 inches holding 30.5 inches of water.

At Horse Camp the average depth was 106.5 inches of snow holding 34 inches of water. The snow surveyors were surprised to find less snow this year than the amount recorded on Jan. 1, 1952, when it measured 109.2 inches holding 33.1 inches of water at Sand's Flat.

At Horse Camp a year ago snow depth measured 121.9 inches, with 37.9 inches of water content.
