The theater, then called the Gem, operated by Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth Roberts, opened in the middle 20's in an old unpainted wooden building across from Gieners' warehouse at the south end of Main street.

After a few years the business was moved to its present location, where it was run by the Roberts until three years ago, when it was sold to Alan Prescott.

The Prescotts operated the theater themselves until this past spring when they leased it out. Reason for closure was lack of business coupled with immediate need of new projection equipment.
