Transit Strike Hits Philadelphia

PHILADELPHIA — Nine thousand Philadelphia Transportation Company workers went on strike today, sending 2½ million transit riders in search of other modes of travel.

The walkout began at midnight as cashiers on the Broad Street subway and Frankford elevated lines stopped accepting fares, giving some late customers an unexpected free ride. The shutdown was effected shortly before 1 a.m. as trolley, subway and bus operators pulled into barns and garages from outlying runs.

To meet the extraordinary crush, railroads and taxi companies added to their facilities and motorists got the family car out of the garage to pick up friends and fellow employees on their way to work.

Industrial firms rushed company trucks into service and the joint committee of the armed forces in the Philadelphia area brought every available bus and truck into play.

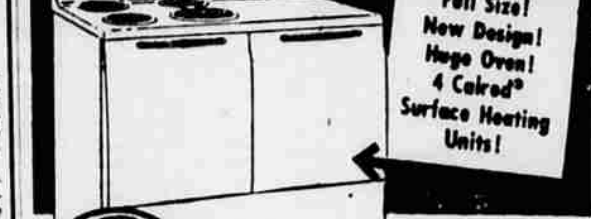
Despite these measures, however, many a stenographer and factory worker was bound to be late on the job this morning.

The walkout came as a surprise to some this morning. They went to bed last night under the impression an agreement reached by union and company negotiators would stand up.

The agreement was announced jointly earlier in the day by Michael J. Quill, international president of the Transport Workers Union, and Albert M. Greenfield, principal company negotiator, after a day-long session in the City Hall office of Mayor Joseph S. Clark Jr.

The proposed pact called for three pay increases, totaling 21 cents an hour, spread over the next year and a half, coupled with a gradual reduction in the work week from the present 48 hours to 40. P.T.C. employees now average \$1.67 an hour.

Immediately after that meeting, Quill left for New York, where he is directing a two-week-old walkout of bus operators.
