'Mommy' Says Agent Cheats

SANTA MONICA, Calif. (AP)—The mother of Jimmy Boyd has demanded an accounting of royalties from the lad's smash record "I Saw Mommy Kissing Santa Claus."

A suit filed yesterday by Mrs. Winnie Boyd of nearby Van Nuys is directed against Abner J. Greshler, who last year signed a seven-year contract to represent the 13-year-old boy.

Mrs. Boyd says the record sold two million copies in 35 days but she and her husband Leslie, formerly of McComb, Miss., and Jimmy, haven't seen much in the line of profits.

She claimed that Greshler took 60 per cent of the profits as Jimmy's producer and another 10 per cent as his agent, that the Boyds "lacked business knowledge" when they signed the contract and that Greshler "acted in bad faith." She said Jimmy has been paid \$3,000 in 13 months.

She asked the court to order an accounting and to give relief from the contract.

Greshler told a reporter that Jimmy has received \$18,000. He also said he had paid for Jimmy's schooling and has spent thousands of dollars to promote him. Greshler added that Jimmy will receive 50 per cent of the net profits from the hit record but the contract is on a November-to-November fiscal year and no accounting has yet been made.

'Mamie Bangs' Now Official

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—The "Mamie bangs" are now official. Hollywood has adopted and recognized them.

While the general lady watches next Tuesday as her husband becomes President Eisenhower, her bangs will find their way into a movie.

Joanne Dru will sport the new hairdo in her current film, "Dressing," which is being shot at universal-International studios.

A studio spokesman commented: "By a typical Hollywoodish coincidence the scene featuring Joanne's bangs will be filmed on Tuesday."

Some 200 voters were seized in downtown Rome when Red youth groups tried to mass in a demonstration against the changes, requested by Premier Alcide de Gasperi's Christian Democrat government.

Film Striptease Planned For Ladylike Greer Garson

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—The Marilyn Monroe bug has even bitten Greer Garson. That most ladylike of stars will do a striptease in her next movie.

The script of "Interrupted Melody," the screen story of Anni-Belle, opera star Marjorie Lawrence, calls for a "Salome" by MGM.

"That means," says MGM, that Greer will look off as many of the seven years as the law—and the screen office will allow.

"Why not?" asks a front office spokesman. "Miss Garson has a body like a starlet."

Her body is well-covered in the flowing robes of a Roman noblewoman in "Julius Caesar." She and Deborah Kerr are the only two women in the cast of the essentially all-male story.

We are just there in dress up the story," she says. "Our parts were so small that we felt like the producer's girl friends while making it."

She also got another picture "Caucasian Captivity" in which she is teamed once more with Walter Pidgeon.

Pidgeon calls himself "the day-liner Buddy Ferguson."

That may explain the new striptease Greer.

He admits that there is even commercialism connected with it. Like Irving Berlin and the Gershwin estate, McHugh claims he spends about \$40,000 a year plugging such hits as "Bunny Blue of the Street," "I Don't Give You Anything But Love," "Don't Stand So Close to Me" and the other McHugh stand-ards.

"With this act," says McHugh, "I can still exploit my songs and collect a little at the same time."
