## Jane Russell, M. Monroe Battle

 HOLLYWOOD — Predictions of fireworks when Jane Russell and Marilyn Monroe squared off to act in the same picture have fizzled. Jane even has become Marilyn's sisterly adviser in matters of love.

Marilyn didn't seek Jane's counsel. Miss Russell says she volunteered to Miss Monroe the view that it's a good idea for an actress to marry a man in another field, like sports.

Jane is married to retired football star Bob Waterfield. Marilyn says she and retired baseball star Joe DiMaggio are "good friends." Jane's reasoning goes like this:

"It's great to have somebody like that to go home to. If you have blow-up ideas about yourself, he talks you out of them in a hurry. If you sound unhappy with your job, he tells you to quit."

"Joe and Robert"—Jane calls her husband Robert—are sensible moneywise. Marilyn isn't, and I've never been. That's another opposite quality, which is great. Then you have a whole."

Jane said she and her husband "have a healthy disregard for each other's profession. When we do something in common, that's when the bees start. This way everybody minds his own business."

The forecasts of jealous rivalry between glitzy champs Monroe and Russell were perhaps reasonable. Scene stealing and all that.

A Paramount producer told Jane when she set out for 20th Century-Fox and "Gentlemen Prefer Blondes": "Shake hands with Marilyn. Flip a coin to see who'll make the first catty crack, then let the fur fly."

Jane says some gossip-lovers have urged her, "Please, couldn't you and Marilyn have just a small beef? And let me be the first to hear about it?"

But after two months' work on the picture, Jane calls Marilyn "a real nice, sweet kid. She works a lot harder than I do." As for scene-stealing: "In all the years I've been in pictures, I have not run into that."

Marilyn expresses equal esteem for Jane and calls her "a good actress in the kind of thing she likes to do." Miss Monroe prefers more serious vehicles for herself.

## Guatemala Leaders Boast

QUATEMALA, Guatemala (AP)—Both the leftist-Communist bloc and its opponents claimed victory in Guatemala province today following a three-day national congressional election.

The main contest in balloting which ended last night centered in the capital. Anti-Reds conceded that the government supported Democratic Front—which includes the Communists—would carry the ultrarural area.

The outcome of the election, to pick 32 congressmen who will sit with 28 hold-over members, will not be known for several days.

Anti-Red spokesmen said they were "assured of victory" in Guatemala city and other districts in the Guatemala province. The Democratic Front acknowledged that critics lagged somewhat in urban areas last night but maintained that a strong labor vote in outlying districts of the province would win for them.

The Congress at present is firmly in the hands of leftist supporters of President Jacobo Arben Guzman.

## Child to Get Rare Surgery

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP)—A delicate operation on a 7-week-old child probably will be performed early this week. The child's father, an Air Force sergeant, consented to surgery.

The little tot is suffering from a fast-growing tumor between the eyes. However, the child's mother refused to authorize the operation without the consent of her husband.

Sgt. Jack W. Garrison, who had never seen little James David, was flown home from Korea by the Air Force on an emergency furlough.

The dangerous surgery will be performed by doctors at the U. S. Naval Hospital in nearby Millington.

The Garrisons have two other sons, 7 and 9 years old.
