Pennsylvania Riot Flares

PITTSBURGH (AP)—A thousand rioting convicts who set fire to Pennsylvania's sprawling Western State Penitentiary and seized five guards as hostages defied hundreds of police to force them into their cells today.

The curbing convicts, shouting for prison reforms, started several fires in the two cellblocks and prison workshops last night.

Not a prisoner escaped—not a shot was fired in the nation's first prison uprising of 1953.

Warden John W. Claudy waited for an early morning conference with top state officials before making his next move. He vowed no compromise.

Huddled in their darkened cellblocks of the 76-year-old prison, the rioters taunted firemen who tried to extinguish the blazing inferno.

Claudy estimated damage at \$50,000.

FREED

The rioters freed one of the guards, 58-year-old Frank Daugherty, within a short time after the outbreak started about 7 p.m. (EST.) But they stubbornly refused to let the others go until their "13 concessions for peace" are met.

The peace demands were passed out in a note to Claudy early today.

The prisoners asked that there be no reprisals against the rioters. They also called for improved food, medical care, a plan to permit visitors to stay longer, investigation into operation of the prison's fund, better mail service, a "complete change of the parole board" and an opportunity to study law books so they can file court petitions.

Claudy didn't bargain.

NO DEALS

Gov. John S. Fine declared: "There will be no deals. We certainly are not going to let prisoners dictate to us what shall be done."

Claudy said he wanted to prevent bloodshed at all costs.

The guards being held are John Pilatic, 35; Joseph Guerra, 26; James Poole, 26; and Edward Ament, 42.

A note passed from one cell block, signed by Guerra and Poole, said both men were all right but "Guerra is bruised up a bit."

Bolt Wins At San Diego

SAN DIEGO, Calif. (AP)—The touring golfers headed east Monday, with a jubilant Tommy Bolt leading the procession as the victor in the second annual \$10,000 San Diego Open tournament.

Bolt proved a wire to wire winner in the San Diego meet, putting together rounds of 66-68-70-70 for a 22 hole total of 274.

The 274 was 14 strokes under par for the San Diego Country Club course, and was good enough to bring \$2,000 to the 34-year-old Bolt, from Maplewood, N. J.

Typhoid Hits German Town

STUTTGART, Germany (AP)—A spreading typhoid epidemic brought a ban last night on the sale of imported endive, a salad herb, in the Stuttgart area. A total of 581 persons have been stricken in the past month and five have died.

Officials said a "considerable degree of probability exists" that the endive is responsible. No American soldiers or civilians have been afflicted by the epidemic.

Iran Government Split Looms

TEHRAN (AP)—An extraordinary coalition which has dominated Iran for almost two years came as the latest round of negotiations on the British-Iranian oil dispute reached another critical stage. In lengthy conferences last week between U. S. Ambassador Loy Henderson and Mosaddegh, new secret American proposals for a settlement were made. The Premier's aides boldly predicted that final agreement was near.

Kashani, powerful religious chief and mainstay of the Mosaddegh government, declared yesterday he would block debate on a bill to extend for a year Mosaddegh's near-dictatorial power to govern by decree. Later a delegation from the Majlis beseeched him to modify his stand.

Mosaddegh reportedly said he was ready to carry the government-shattering issue to the people in a nation-wide broadcast and call for a referendum to settle it.

Informed sources said Mosaddegh had told a Majlis delegation yesterday that Kashani would be going beyond his power as speaker of the House to withdraw any bill from the agenda. The Premier maintained that such a move would have to be petitioned by 15 deputies and then voted on.

Kashani's son said his father had agreed to the special Parliament session today.
