New Potato Market Report

Increasing its market coverage, The Herald and News begins this week a daily report on the potato market as compiled by the Oregon State Extension Service and received here by mail.

POTATO MARKETS, JAN. 16 At Portland today the potato supply was moderate. The demand was good and the market was slightly stronger.

At San Francisco today the potato market was about steady. Track sales of Klamath russets, U. S. No. 1 & 2 such minimum, brought 4.35 in a few bid overs sales today.

At Chicago today the potato supply was liberal. The demand was fair and the market was about steady. Track sales of Idaho russets, U. S. No. 1A, washed, brought 5.10 to 5.25.

At Idaho Falls Friday the potato offerings were moderate. The wire inquiry was moderate and the market was about steady with a slightly weaker undertone.

McKay described himself as a "middle-of-the-roader" on public power. "I am neither for nor against public power as such nor private power as such," he explained.

McKay said that during his term as governor in Oregon he had an active council working on the Indian problem and that the Legislature repealed two laws discriminatory to Indians.

On the matter of off-shore oil reserves, which were administered by the Interior Department but now have been ordered transferred to the Navy, McKay said he was a states rights man and therefore for state ownership of the oil reserves off-shore but within state boundaries.
