## Odell's Firing Official

**SEATTLE (AP)** — The man who will succeed Howie Odell as University of Washington football coach probably will be found on the campus, Athletic Director Harvey Cassill indicated Sunday.

Declaring he is seeking a "happy family in football" at Washington, Cassill said he is "willing to go on one of those transcontinental hunts for a coach, but I doubt if we can do better than what we have at home."

**CANDIDATES**

Top candidates for the ousted Odell's job, he said, are Johnny Cherberg, freshman coach whose teams have a record of 23 wins in 24 starts, and Neil J. (Skip) Stahley, backfield coach under Odell.

Cassill said he would talk with both Cherberg and Stahley and make his recommendation to the University's Board of Regents this week.

The board followed Cassill's recommendations Saturday when it fired Odell after a year remaining on his \$18,000 a year contract.

The board's announcement said only that it had approved the recommendation Odell not be retained and would be ready to meet on call to consider a successor.

**APPEARS**

Odell appeared briefly before the board Saturday.

Later he bitterly criticized Cassill, university Vice President H. P. Everest, and Dr. Alfred Strauss of Chicago, a prominent university alumnus.

Odell described Cassill as "just a stooge for Everest," and promised a public statement in the near future on his difficulties at the university.
