Oregon Men Held on Fraud

LOS ANGELES (U) — Five Oregon men and one from Washington State are under indictment here on federal charges of misusing veterans' priorities in the purchase of war surplus trucks. Assistant U. S. Atty. Ray Kinnison identified them Tuesday as John M. Fields, Rex Clemens and George Shroyer of Philomath, Ore.; Francis William Fetherston and Ben Ellis of Corvallis, Ore.; and John Frank Burkhardt of Yakima, Wash.

Kinnison said the indictment involves the purchase of government trucks at Port Hueneme, Calif., in 1946. The six are charged with conspiracy and making false statements to the War Assets Administration in connection with the purchase, he said.

GOP Aims At Postmasters

WASHINGTON (U) — Republicans have found they can take over more than 2,100 postmasterships immediately and are going to start making the appointments soon, it was learned today.

GOP senators have asked the Post Office Department to check on the number of posts now filled by acting postmasters. The figure already has topped the 2,100 mark with two states to go.

Former President Truman named acting postmasters for some of the vacancies, but the new administration will send up its own names for the jobs.

Anne Baxter Gets Divorce

LOS ANGELES (U) — Anne Baxter, who once told a columnist that she was "divinely happy" with her husband, actor John Hodiak, has divorced him.

The 29-year-old actress obtained the uncontested decree on cruelty grounds yesterday.

Weeping, she told the judge that Hodiak, 38, mimicked and mocked her, fell asleep amid playing of a record of a dramatic sketch in the presence of an author, and finally told her to see a lawyer.

Miss Baxter was awarded custody of their daughter Katrina, 18 months; \$550 a month child support; \$50 a month for a trust fund for the child; \$1 a month token alimony; and residence.

The Hodiaks were married July 7, 1946, at Burlingame, Calif.
