**English People Protest Hanging of 19-Year-Old**

LONDON (AP) — A 19-year-old Briton was hanged today for a murder that he did not fire—despite a dramatic 11th-hour appeal for his life to Queen Elizabeth.

The youth, Derek Bentley, took part in a holdup in which a policeman was killed. A companion, who actually fired the fatal shot, escaped with an indeterminate prison sentence because he was only 16 years old.

Bentley was hanged at Wandsworth Prison in the suburbs of London while a boiling, shouting crowd demonstrated outside the walls.

He went to the gallows despite an appeal by his friends to the Queen that she override her Cabinet advisers and stay the execution. Earlier, Home Secretary Sir David Maxwell Fyfe had rejected clemency pleas signed by more than 200 members of Parliament.

A crowd of approximately 300 persons milling outside the prison boomed and shouted as the man, bound and shrouded as the man, was hung open at 9:10 a.m. (4:10 a.m. EST) for the notice of execution to be posted.

A glass shielding the prison gate bulletin board was smashed in the crush. Police reinforcements were called to handle the crowd and
