Multi-Million Pipeline OK'd

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Federal Power Commission Thursday authorized Pacific Northwest Pipeline Corp. of Houston, Tex., to file a substitute application for permission to build a multi-million dollar natural gas pipeline from the Southwest's San Juan Basin to the Pacific Northwest.

The commission also announced Trans-Northwest Gas Inc., of Spokane, Wash., has asked permission to build a \$18,765,400 pipeline to serve markets in Eastern Washington and Northern Idaho.

The agency said the Texas corporation was permitted to file its substitute application under an order which schedules new natural gas service hearings here Feb. 18.

The company's plans call for piping natural gas from the San Juan Basin and from the Big Pine Field in Wyoming to Washington, Northern Oregon, Idaho, Utah, Wyoming and Colorado.

Trans-Northwest, which previously asked permission to import and export natural gas from and to Canada, would supply Spokane, Ephrata, Moses Lake, Chehalis, and Colville, Wash., Coeur d'Alene, Kellogg and Wallace, Idaho, and Trail, B. C.

Both companies said they hoped to supply gas to the Hanford, Wash., atomic energy plant.

Commie Denies Son Quitting

ROME (AP)—Italian Communist chief Palmiro Togliatti says a newspaper report that his son Aldo has given up Communism and plans to join the Roman Catholic church is a phony.

The Red boss declared last night that Aldo has been working in Russia for two years.

The report in the Independent Rome newspaper Messaggero said that Aldo had been in contact with Avilio Cardinal Fossati of Turin regarding his plans. The cardinal also denied the report, declaring he did not know young Togliatti.

Alaska Gets New Governor

JUNEAU, Alaska (AP)—Bob Reeve, a veteran Alaskan pilot, got the Alaska Republican Central Committee's nod for territorial governor Friday.

Agreement on the defeated Republican nominee for the congressional delegate's office was announced by Sen. Elton Engstrom, Juneau, central committee chairman, and Robert McKenna, Fairbanks, national committeeman.

Engstrom and McKenna announced Reeve got nine of 14 committee votes on the deciding ballot. The recommendation will be sent to Secretary of the Interior McKay.

Other committee members said unofficially Frank Heintzleman, U. S. Regional Forester for Alaska who once held the favorite's role for the job, had four votes on the deciding ballot and Elmer Rasmuson, Anchorage banker, had one.

Republican leaders have said McKay has assured them he would make an appointment through party channels and trusted the central committee to come up with an agreement in the controversial field.

Reeve came to Alaska 21 years ago after a flying career which included pioneering an air mail route over the Andes between Chile and Argentina. He is married and has five children.

Lofty Andes Peak Crowded

BUENOS AIRES (AP)—The loftiest peak in the Andes, Mt. Aconcagua, was also the busiest early this week.

Three different expeditions of mountaineers—Japanese, Argentine and Brazilian—claimed ascensions were spaced far enough apart, however, that nobody was crowded off the towering pinnacle.

Lt. Francisco Thomas of the Argentine Army last night said that on Monday he was the first climber to scale Aconcagua from the southern approach. Japanese climbers from Washeda University reported they had reached the top from the north a few hours earlier.

Another report, to the newspaper Nacion, said still another expedition — two men from Brazil — reached the mountain top simult-
