'A Guy in the Eighth Row Can Kiss Marilyn Monroe'

HOLLYWOOD (AP) - Twentieth Century-Fox is converting at once to a big new photographic and sound system so realistic, a spokesman says, "a guy in the eighth row can kiss Marilyn Monroe."

The device is called Cinemascope. It creates a third-dimension illusion, the studio announced yesterday, and presages an era "as far-reaching as the transfer from silent pictures to sound in 1927."

Fox's method permits filming in color and projection on a screen 2 1/2 times ordinary size "so as to give almost lifelike animation to the players. This creates the same feeling of audience participation as attendance at a performance by living players on the speaking stage."

'Schnozzle' With a Toupe Would Be Good 'Juvenill'

HOLLYWOOD (AP) - "That's my boy," exclaimed Jimmy Durante as he gazed at a young man who possessed the same sandpaper voice and outlandish nose.

His "boy" was Jackie Barnett, Durante's composer, writer, confidante and initiator for more than a decade. Barnett, who looks much younger than his 32 years, is also currently portraying the early-day hitman in "The Eddie Cantor Story."

"How come they didn't ask me to play the role?" asked Durante when he visited the set. "Put a toupe on my head and I'll look just like a juvenile."

But young Keefe Brannelle is playing Cantor, so that required someone even more "juvenile" than the giggling Jimmy Barnett, who was seen in action by a talent scout at a Durante TV rehearsal, was chosen. He has the Durante voice and gestures down pat, and the illusion is complete with a Cyrano-like nose from the makeup department.

After 11 years with Durante, Barnett has no trouble imitating the great James. In fact, his main trouble is not imitating Durante.

"I even went to college two years," sighed Barnett, "but you never know it now. I can hardly talk English any more, because of the years with Durante. The other night a girl corrected me because I kept saying 'dilemma.' I had been with Jimmy so long that I had forgotten it was dilemma."

Being associated with the comic also precludes any family life, the writer added. He goes wherever Jimmy goes, and the next few months will include trips to Miami, Las Vegas, Reno and New York.

"I miss having a place to call home," Barnett remarked. "I've got belongings in hotels all over the country."

But the association has brought him wealth and a barrel of laughs. It started when Barnett began writing radio gags with Eddie Davis, a former taxi driver.

"I started in show business as a kid," he explained. "I used to stage and emcee the shows at my father's night club in Union City, N. J. I went to New York and ran into Davis, who was a funny guy but couldn't write. He needed somebody to write down his gags and I did the job."

When Durante got back into radio in 1941 after a considerable absence, he sent for Davis. The kidding ex-cabbie entered Durante's dressing room with long underwear on instead of pants. Barnett was along and soon began imitating Durante.

"How'd ya like that?" exploded Durante. "One guy comes in here with no pants on and the other guy starts stealing my act! I'm not."

Chiang Navy Ready to Go

HONOLULU (AP) - Vice Adm. Ma Chi-chuang, Nationalist China's chief of naval operations, said today the Chinese Navy is ready to stage commando-type raids on the Communist China coast, if President Eisenhower releases the U. S. Seventh Fleet from guarding Formosa Strait.

"We are always ready," he said. But he said systematic major attacks on the China coast were "a question of time."

"I cannot say how long it would take to organize a major attack," he said in an interview. "It is not purely a Navy matter."

Ma passed through Honolulu en route to Washington. He was accompanied by Maj. Gen. Chou Yuhuan, commandant of the Chinese Marine Corps.

Ma said he was "very pleased" with President Eisenhower's reported decision, but that there was "no relation" between it and his trip to Washington.

"It's purely coincidence," he said. "The reports reached us after we left Formosa."

In principle, I am very pleased," he said. He knew of "no prior discussion" of the reported plan. Ma would not reply directly when asked if Nationalist forces were in a position to attack the China coast without U. S. air and naval support.

"The United States and China have a common aim in fighting communism," he said. "If the Chinese Navy had more strength, we would have more confidence."

18 Missing In Big Fire

PUSAN (AP) - Eighteen Koreans were reported missing today in the wake of Pusan's most destructive fire.

Authorities officially estimated the loss at 11 million dollars.

The fire burned out one square mile in the heart of this war-torn city, leaving a vast area of charred ruins.

Investigations said the fire started in a two-story wooden shack-like restaurant after a waitress carrying a kerosene lamp fell.

Death Takes Dolly Gann

WASHINGTON (AP) - Dolly Curtis Gann, sister of former Vice President Charles Curtis and long prominent in Washington Republican circles, died Friday night at age 67.

Mrs. Gann was official hostess for her brother when he was vice president under Herbert Hoover, and it was during the Hoover administration that she waged a famous battle in social protocol.

Alice Longworth, wife of Nicholas Longworth, speaker of the House, said her husband believed the speaker's wife should precede the vice president's hostess at social gatherings. The diplomatic corps finally settled things by announcing that Dolly Gann should be accorded the status of "a wife of the vice president of the United States."

In later years, Mrs. Gann served as president of the District of Columbia League of Republican Women, president of the Senior Congress Club and of the Senate Women's Club.

Burial services are scheduled here Monday.

Pine Production Up, Orders Lag

PORTLAND (AP) - Pine production is up, but orders are running behind the pace set in the first month of last year, the Western Pine Association reported Saturday.

For the first four weeks of the year orders are 11 per cent under the 1952 rate, while production is up 26 per cent.

In the past week orders totaled 63 1/2 million board feet, compared with 65 million the previous week and 78 1/2 million last year at this time.

Hog Slaughter Time Shorter

SALEM (AP) - All hogs shipped into Oregon must be slaughtered within 24 hours after arrival.

That order was issued Friday by E. L. Peterson of the State Agriculture Department because of an outbreak in the Midwest of vesicular exanthema—a contagious hog disease.

The order bans the import of breeding swine and feeder pigs. Peterson said he had been considering an import ban on all hogs, but added that such a step apparently is not yet necessary.

Two shipments of diseased hogs arrived in Oregon last week. Pigs from those shipments infected three lots of hogs in the Portland area.

The federal Agriculture Department has been asked by Gov. Paul Patterson to compensate owners for hogs that have been slaughtered because of the disease.
