Bodies Not Buried Due to Strike

NEW YORK (AP) — Five hundred bodies lay unburied in receiving vaults in the month-old strike of 200 gravediggers and other workers at seven Jewish and non-sectarian cemeteries.

There appeared no prospect of an early settlement of the strike, which began Jan. 7 and spread to

three other cemeteries a week ago.

At five Jewish cemeteries affected by the strike, relatives and friends of some 250 persons who died since the strike began dug graves and buried their own dead.

The union, Local 246, Building Service Employees International Union, AFL, has asked \$6 to \$10 weekly wage increases, sick leave and other benefits.

Archers Need Aid To Lay Out Field

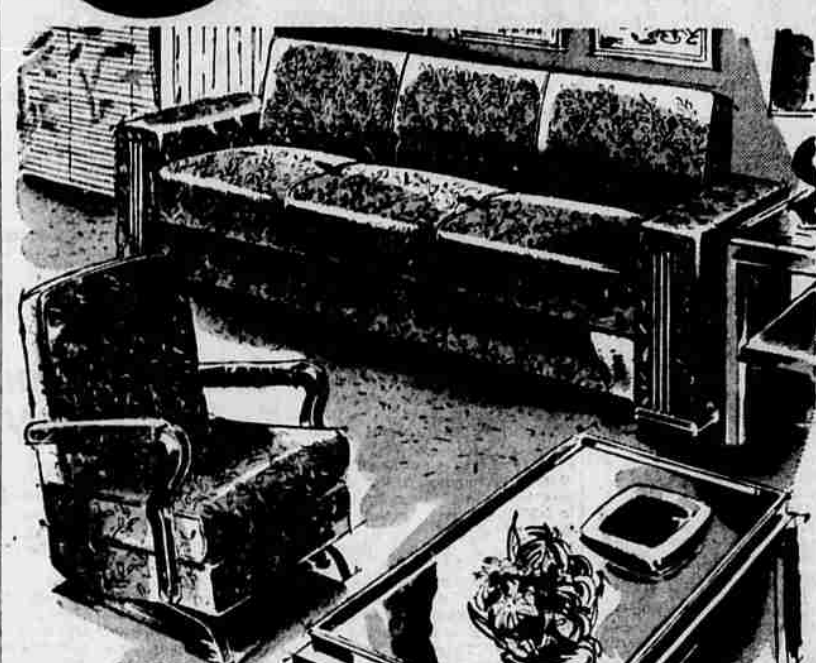
The Klamath Archers start laying out a field course at Moore Park Sunday and they'll welcome all the help they can get. Target captain Cecil Prather said yesterday.

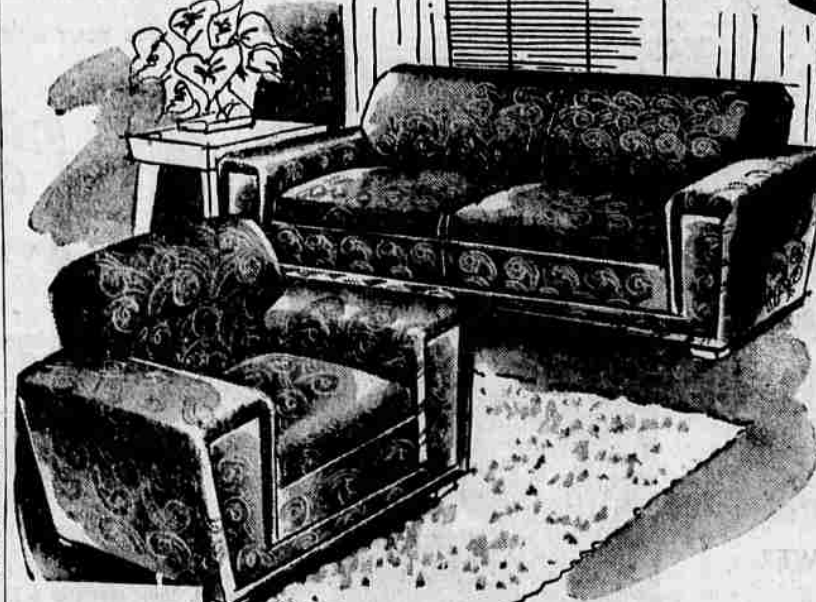
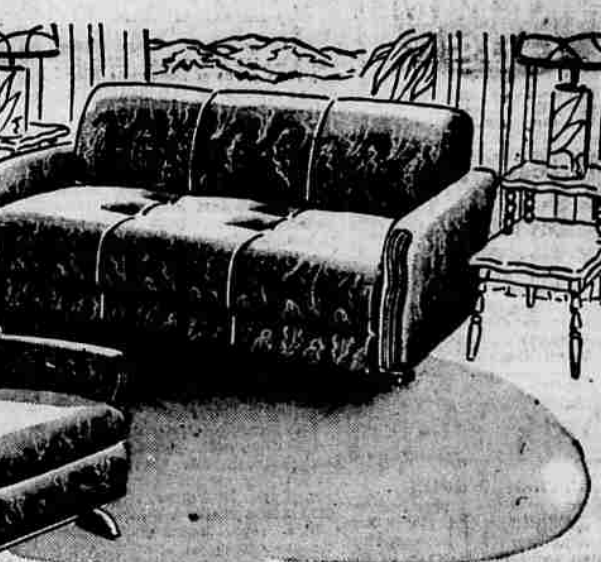
