Dulles In Belgium On Long Survey

BRUSSELS, Belgium (AP) — John Foster Dulles arrived in Belgium today to continue his survey of European defense planning...

President Eisenhower's big four-motored plane brought the U. S. secretary of state and American foreign aid chief Harold Stassen here after a brief flight from flood-devastated Holland.

The two American leaders were welcomed by Belgian Foreign Minister Paul Van Zeeland, U. S. Ambassador Myron T. Cowen and other Belgian and American officials.

In a departing statement before he left Holland, Dulles told newsmen that he and Stassen "have been encouraged to find that there, as well as in the other capitals we have visited, the concept of a European Defense Community within the framework of the Atlantic community is regarded by your leaders and your people, as it is by ours, as the most effective way to ensure peace and security for us all."

Army Cuts Construction

WASHINGTON (AP) — After Saturday the armed services may award no new construction contracts. They must also halt projects under way that cannot be justified as essential.

Moreover, the services must keep their civilian employment at the Jan. 31 level, must not use military personnel to replace civilians nor assign any more military personnel to administrative activities or headquarters within the United States.

That was the gist of orders issued Friday by Defense Secretary Wilson in line with President Eisenhower's economy program. All planned construction projects are halted until they can be reviewed and a decision made as to which ones to carry on.

The individual service secretaries have been directed also to submit reports on construction they deem essential and to report immediately any exceptions to the manpower freeze they think must be permitted to protect life, property or the national security.

More than a third of the \$10 billion dollars for military construction voted since the start of the Korean War has not yet been spent.

Navy Hosts AFL Leaders

MIAMI, Fla. (AP) — The Navy today invited top leaders of the AFL on a 60-mile Florida coastwise run in two swift warships.

Members of the AFL Executive Council and 50 other AFL leaders here for the council's mid-winter session, planned to board either the USS William R. Rush, a new-type, 2,200-ton destroyer, or the USS Darby, an 1,800-ton destroyer escort.

The only stay-at-home was AFL President George Meany, who has spent a busy week presiding over the mid-winter strategy session of the Executive Council at its Monte Carlo Hotel headquarters near here.

Comdr. C. P. Houglund of the Navy Department's office of public relations said today's trip was arranged by the civilian relations office of the Navy as part of a program to educate prominent civilians to the mission of the U. S. Navy.

The half a hundred labor union officials include a liberal assortment of labor chiefs whose unions played a major role in building the two fleet vessels. Unionists engaged in the shipbuilding industry include the representatives in today's excursion include the boiler-makers, sheetmetal workers, plumbers, ironworkers, and the building craft unions.

Jap BPA Bid Said Lowest

PORTLAND (AP) — A Japanese firm bid to supply the Bonneville Power Administration with suspension insulators was almost 50 percent lower than bids supplied by six U. S. firms, a BPA spokesman reported Friday.

Nippon Gaiishi Kaisha, Ltd., Nagoya, bid \$198,200 for supplying the large porcelain insulators. Local bids were \$372,600 f.o.b. destination.

Twenty-five per cent is added to foreign bids, the spokesman said, plus the tariff or duty. If, after these two additions, the bid still is low, it then is considered on the basis of meeting specifications. The Japanese bid appeared to be within these limits.
