WASHINGTON (AP)—Chairman Langer (R-ND) of the Senate Judiciary Committee urged "Thursday that Atty. Gen. Brownell close down Alcatraz, the government's fortress-like prison in San Francisco Bay.

Langer also heads the federal prison subcommittee, a group set up during the 80th Congress at his urging to inspect the penal institutions.

He said that when he last visited Alcatraz, about two years ago, it had only about 150 prisoners and yet its operating costs run over half a million dollars a year.

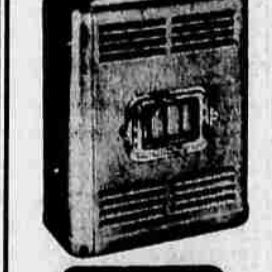
