### Drainage At Midland Eyed

The possibility of improving drainage over a widespread area near Midland, and thereby improving alkali conditions for farming, is to be discussed at Monday's annual meeting of the Klamath Soil Conservation District in the Midland Grange Hall. Plans are being proposed for the improvement of drainage facilities west and north of Miller Hill. Ejector drains are planned, and there is talk of installing a pump at the intersection of a principal drain, the diversion canal and the old Midland road. The pump would carry water from the drain into the canal, and the drainage problem would be improved, according to the feeling of the SCD's board of supervisors. The SCD's annual meeting is set for 6:30 p.m. Monday, and is to be public.

### Less Snow But Wetter

ALTURAS — Snow measurements made on Sweagert Flat, above Ain, Modoc County, show much less snow on the ground this year than last, though what is there has much heavier water content. Last year's snow 7.7 inches or 43 per cent water content, while this year's had an average water content of 20 inches.

Data obtained on this and other treks are compiled by the State Division of Water Resources in Sacramento, and is used to forecast the amount of water available for agricultural purposes during the coming year. The forecasts are made available to farmers, ranchers and other interested parties.

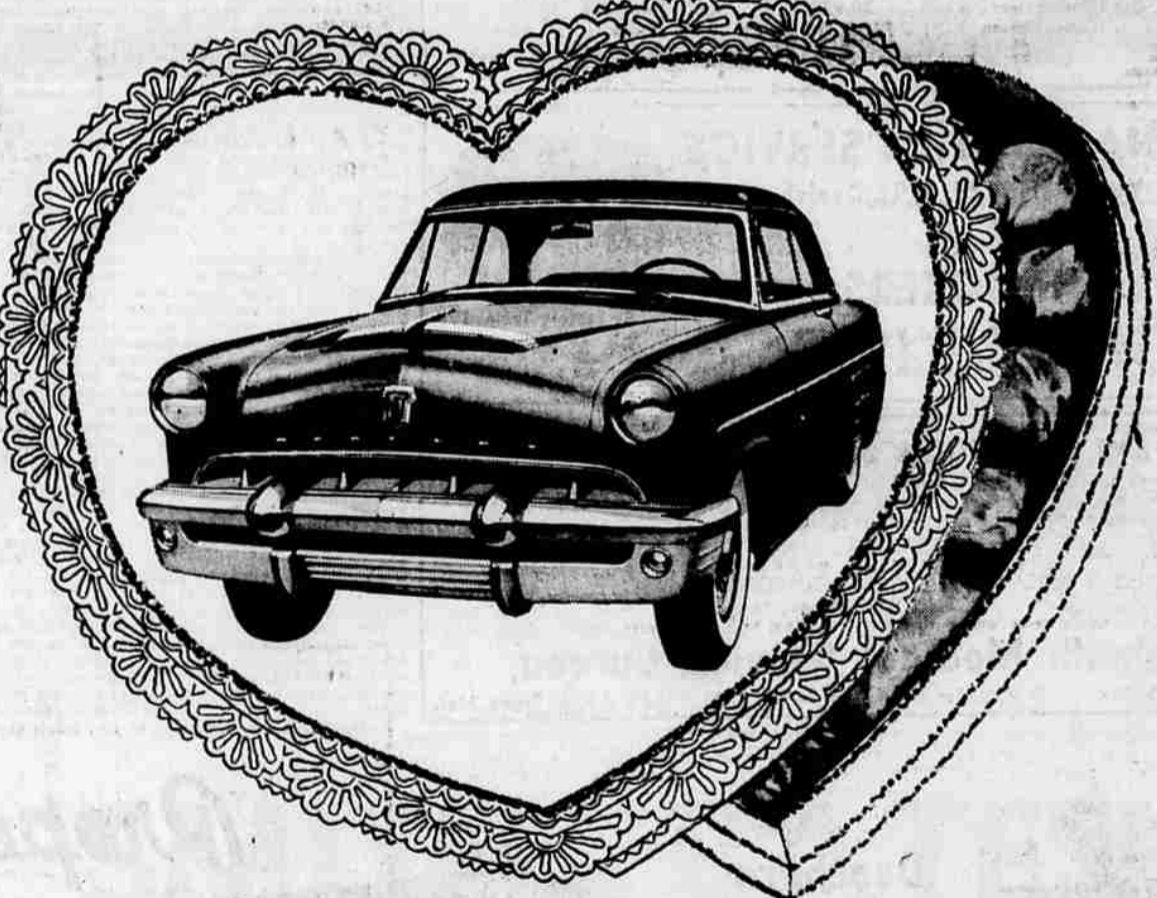
