### MP's Probe Murder Death

PORTLAND (P) — The Air Force is investigating the fatal shooting near Casablanca, French Morocco, of Mrs. Barbara Jean Combs, 24, whose body is being returned to her Portland home for burial.

Her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Roland B. McKenzie, said they understood Mrs. Combs, the wife of an Air Force sergeant, was shot Jan. 30 by looters who broke into the couple's house about 15 miles from Casablanca.

Her husband, T. Sgt. Roy Combs, already has returned to Portland with their three small children. He was unavailable for comment.

The McKenzies said they were advised by telegram from the Air Force that their daughter's death was under investigation.

Rep. Norblad (R-Ore), who checked on the case, said the Pentagon confirmed Mrs. Combs' death but would give out no details until the investigation is completed.
